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A TALE OF FOUR CITIES

History is like a river, now rising and gushing furiously, now serene and calm. When wild, it sweeps all obstacles out of its path; when tranquil, it brings blessing and fertility to the environment. There is strong unpredictability, for it may hold its course for ages and then, with abrupt suddenness, break new grounds, leaving former splendor in decline and decay.

Historical highlights are ahead of us in the steady path of our Jewish calendar: Purim and Pesach, established landmarks, this year augmented by two commemorative milestones. Shabos Hagodol (April 11) is dedicated to the 50th anniversary of the expulsion of the Jews from Spain, and Yom Yerusholaim (May 31) marks the 25th anniversary of the reunification of Jerusalem.

These four benchmarks in our national existence present a multi-colored panorama of Jewish destiny. We were born in the cauldron of Egypt, brutally enslaved, under the lash of Pharaoh's taskmasters forced to build the ancient fortress of Raamses. But Pesach celebrates our redemption.

Our lives hung in the balance in ancient Persia in whose capital Shushan our arch-enemy Haman frivolously left it to the casting of lots to determine the date of our extermination. But Purim celebrates our deliverance.

Fanatic zealots propelled by religious frenzy tortured, maimed and burned us alive during the barbaric reign of Torquemada, Grand Inquisitor of Toledo, Spain, beginning in 1492 and claiming the lives of tens of thousands.

But — not only are Paraoh, Haman and Torquemada gone, leaving ignominious blots on the pages of history books, but also their seats of power, Raamses, Shushan and Toledo are now mere dots on the radar screen of the annals of mankind, weak, ineffective, almost forgotten.

Not so the eternal Jewish capital, "city of gold, copper and light" — Jerusalem!

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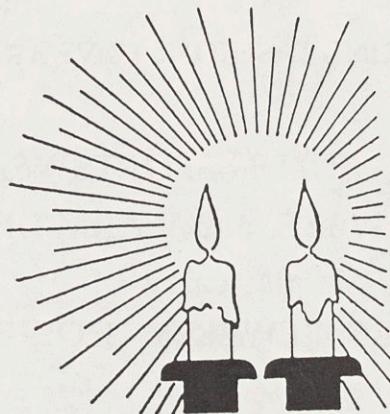
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A SUGGESTION TO OUR MEMBERS
