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FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

The festival of Shevuot, which marks the acceptance of the Torah by the Jewish people, occurs forty-nine days after Passover. In fact, we are Biblically ordained to count each of these days and to recite a separate blessing for each day. The counting of the Omer (a special measure of grain brought to the Holy Temple during each of the days), therefore, serves as a bridge between Passover and Shevuot, two of the three major festivals of the Jewish calendar.

Passover symbolizes national rebirth and political independence while Shevuot commemorates religious commitment and ethical obligation. Our connective count inextricably binds the one to the other, emphasizing the emptiness of freedom without responsibility, independence without an ideal. The Jews achieved a "freedom from" with the exodus which was transformed into a "freedom for" at Sinai. The first is almost valueless without the second. Perhaps this is the higher reason for a count of each passing day which ends with Shevuot: After Passover, we counted each day for ourselves ("And you shall count for yourselves from the morrow after the Sabbath . . .") and on Shevuot we dedicated each day to God.

The twentieth century is one in which people all all over the world are struggling for—and achieving—their freedom. It would be well for them to remember the Biblical connection between freedom and obligation.

SHEVUOT LAW AND LORE

Tikun Leil Shevuot —

Study for the perfection of the soul during the first night of Shevuot. It is a custom to remain awake engrossed in Torah for the entire night to symbolize our dedication to God's law. Shacharit Morning Services are held at the first rays of the new dawn.

Milk products mark the culinary aspect of Shevuot as a symbol of the inherent humility of one who studies the Torah. Learning is within the province of the poor as well as the rich, and so the menu is a more moderate "milchig" one on Shevuot.

GROUND DEDICATION

Sunday afternoon, April 24, at 2:00, on the corner of Amsterdam Avenue and 69th Street, marked the first milestone in the erection of the new Lincoln Square Synagogue. Close to eight hundred men, women and children crowded into our 70 x 100 lot to participate in the dedication of the ground purchased from the Aluminum Company of America.

Despite the inclement weather — and although the rain stopped before the ceremonies began, it continued to tease throughout the speeches — almost everyone remained at his seat until the final benediction. Rabbi Dr. Leo Jung of the Jewish Center gave the invocation, after which HaRav Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of the Yeshiva University, spoke of his close association with the youthful leadership of the Lincoln Square Synagogue. "Your Synagogue is a living testimony that traditional Judaism can flourish among the younger intellectual generation in America," said Dr. Belkin. "And you know, I believe it is the only Synagogue in which the Rabbi and the President look so much alike," he concluded.

State Comptroller Arthur Levitt and Attorney General Lefkowitz were among the dignitaries who addressed the gathering. Mr. Lefkowitz expressed the importance of the Synagogue to Jewish communal life and urged everyone present to "help the Rabbi by attending services faithfully."

Rabbi Riskin reminisced that during the first six Sabbaths of services in December '64 it rained each week-end, and that since rain serves as a symbol of life and growth we must not be disappointed by the weather. He empha-

sized the fact that the dedication was taking place on Yom Hazikaron (Memorial day of Jewish martyrs) but a few hours before the advent of Yom HaAtzmaut (Israeli Independence Day), symbolizing the commitment to past tradition and concern for transmitting a relevant faith to the future which characterizes our Synagogue.

Robert C. Erickson, Vice-President and General Manager of Alcoa Properties, outlined the fine relationship existing between Alcoa and the Lincoln Square Synagogue, stating that "we are proud to have participated with you in the past and expect to continue to an even greater extent in the future."

Vaughn Chase, President of Alcoa Residences, then presented Rabbi Riskin and Daniel Mars with two aluminum gold-plated shovels with which to begin to break ground, please God.

President Daniel Mars concluded with stirring words of faith in the dynamic concept of our Synagogue. Rabbi Morris Finer, director of Community Service Division, Yeshiva University, gave the Benediction.

A special vote of thanks is due Martin Silverberg, Chairman of the Committee, and his co-chairmen, Mrs. Max Belsky, Charles Blumenfeld and William Nathanson. Sidney Trompeter was the professional chairman of the event who remained in perfect control of the inspiring program. A Synagogue which has such a dedicated team of leaders and participants—who barely moved despite the threatening weather—cannot but become a beacon of religious Jewry.

DID YOU KNOW?*Compiled by Dr. Milton Werbel*

THAT our government still follows the policies of John Foster Dulles initiated in 1955 when they still refused to sell arms to Israel to balance weapons being sold Egypt by the Soviet Union.

THAT our government has been sending M48 tanks to Jordan. This was announced by the USIS with pictures of the arrival of the tanks at Aquaba.

THAT Great Britain and the United States are joining in a \$400 million plane and missile deal to Saudi Arabia.

THAT the Moscow Correspondent of KOL HAAM quoted Soviet Personalities as pointing out that the Soviet Union had diplomatic relations with Israel, stressing the belief that all conflicts between countries should be solved by peaceful means and that this included the Israel-Arab conflict. Yet at the Havana meeting of communist nations a resolution was approved condemning the Zionist movement and the existence of Israel, denouncing western support of Israel and warning all African states that Israel's programs of technical aid were imperialistic and neo-colonialism.

THAT the failure of UN members to supply funds probably will cause the recall of UN forces now acting as a buffer between Israel and the Arab Countries.

THAT it is rumored that American scientists are now assisting Egypt in perfecting their missile program.

THAT Egypt will permit the S/S President Roosevelt to pass through the Suez Canal and stop at Haifa as long as they do not carry cargo.

THAT Yeshiva University has been granted \$536,870, for its community health program in the South Bronx, by the Office of Economic Opportunity.

THAT Israel's Bedouins living in the restricted military zones of the Negev

no longer need military passes to move about the country.

THAT about 60,000 Arabs living in the triangle area around Nazareth will also be relieved of the necessity of having passes to visit the military zone.

THAT the president of the Jewish Community of Madrid has appealed to the leaders of Spain to endorse the Ecumenical Council's declaration on Jews. This will be needed if the ritual murder charges and other anti-semitic teachings are to be removed from the classrooms of Spain.

THAT when President Truman was approached to permit a Hebrew University Building to be named in his honor he stated "I want no monuments or memorials all I want is peace." This is what led to the establishment of the Harry S. Truman Center for the Advancement of Peace in the Hebrew University.

THAT the Iranian Ambassador to Lebanon was asked to leave for publishing the statement that President Nasser caused the massacring of Arabs by spreading discord.
