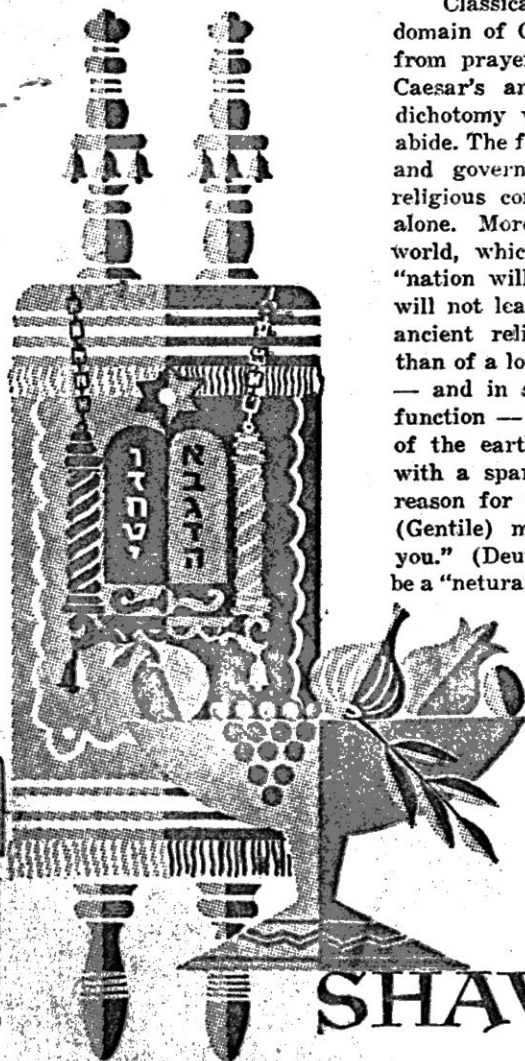
From The Rabbi's Desk

Classical Judaism has always maintained that the domain of God's Law includes every area of human life, from prayer to politics. "Render unto Caesar what is Caesar's and unto God what is God's" establishes a dichotomy which the spirit of the Talmud could never abide. The fact that our Legal Codes discuss business ethics and government morality is clear proof that Jewish religious concern was never relegated to the Synagogue alone. Moreover, our prophetic vision is that of a united world, which will accept the rulership of God so that "nation will not lift up sword against nation, and man will not learn war anymore." We were the first of the ancient religions to speak of a Universal God rather than of a local deity, and the Almighty promises Abraham — and in so doing charges him with a most universal function — "that in you shall be blessed *all the families of the earth.*" Our Torah endows every human being with a spark of the Divine, and the Bible explains the reason for the Sabbath laws to be "in order that your (Gentile) man-servant and maid-servant shall rest *like you.*" (Deuteronomy) Clearly we were never meant to be a "neturai karta" of the nations.

We are living in most perilous times. The cruel assassination of Martin Luther King, a prince of peace who sincerely believed in non-violent methods for the attainment of possible and necessary goals, and the concomitant use of Black Power Nationalists threatens to engulf our country in another Civil war. The rioting in Columbia University and on many

Shavuot Law and Lore

Tikun Leil Shavuot — Study for the perfection of the soul during the first night of Shavuot. Every holiday has a special object as the symbol of its observance — Passover *mazot*, Sukkos *Etrog* and Chanukah *menorah*. Shavuot commemorates the giving of the Torah to the Jewish people, and the study of Torah is therefore the only significant Festival symbol. It is a custom to remain awake engrossed in Torah for the entire first night of the holiday to express our dedication to God's law. Shacharit Morning Services are held at the first rays of the new dawn.

Milk Products mark the culinary aspects of Shavuot. According to Jewish tradition, the wicked Holofernes wished to destroy the Jewish community in Israel. The valiant Judith enticed him to her home where she fed him to surfeit with blintzes and milk. As soon as he fell asleep, she severed his head from his body, thus significantly contributing to the Jewish military victory. As we eat our milk products this Shavuot, let us remember our responsibility to our Land "flowing with milk and honey," and do all in our power to protect the homeland of the Jewish people from her many vicious enemies. The future of the Jewish people is inextricably bound up with the future of Medinat Yisrael, and even the Jews of the Diaspora are historic citizens of the Land of Israel. May we never waiver in our commitment, responsibility and dedication.

other college campuses throughout the country—although not entirely unrelated to the Civil Rights issue and undoubtedly based upon many justifiable complaints — is symptomatic of the disregard for law and order and total lack of structure so prevalent in contemporary America. All of this, together with the threat of nuclear destruction which constantly threatens and looms ever greater as the hot war continues in Viet Nam, the warm war continues in the Middle East and the cold war continues throughout the world can hardly serve to inspire us with optimistic confidence in the future.

As a Rabbi in Israel, my primary function is the preservation of our faith in a world which desperately needs faith and meaning. I must endeavor to guide our people back to God, and to instruct and inspire in the truths of our law. However, I must likewise address myself to the problems of our time, to issues of Equal Rights, Peace and War, Civil Disobedience, etc. If Judaism cannot supply guidance in these directions — which are vital to the life of our society — then halacha is bankrupt and God is dead. To paraphrase Reb Yisrael Salanter, the material concerns of our society become the religious concerns of Jewish law, and we must meaningfully speak out.

Undoubtedly, I am hardly a political, sociological or economic expert, and it is not my desire to turn the pulpit into a New York Times editorial Meeting. However, my area of competence is Jewish law, and halacha is vitally concerned with the rights of each individual and the creation of a just and compassionate society. The guidelines established by Jewish law must be investigated and expressed in relevant and contemporary terms. If we honestly believe in the eternity of our faith, it must have a meaningful message for our troubled times.
