From The Rabbi's Desk

We are living in a city battle-scarred and tempest-torn with racial unrest and acts of violence. Stores are looted, demonstrations are staged, law-abiding citizens are frightened to leave their homes after dark, and our Public School System is ravaged with strike and strife. The ugly and all-too-familiar specter of Anti-Semitism is a major issue in these days of tension and stress. The peace and safety of every Jew in America — and ultimately of Israel as well — are being threatened by the recent turn of events in New York City.

The Jewish attitude towards the black has been clearly delineated in our Torah and by our Sages. Man is created in God's image, and therefore the Jew has a religious obligation to protect the right of every individual regardless of race, creed or color. The Talmud instructs the Jew to support the poor gentile, visit the sick gentile, and bury the dead gentile (Gittin 60b). The entire Festival of Passover teaches that no man may enslave another, that every human being is entitled to freedom for educational and professional opportunity. It is certainly as a result — sometimes on a subconscious level — of these religious teachings that Jews have been in the forefront of the Civil Rights movement and Anti-Poverty legislation.

However, many Jews do not seem to understand that we have a primary obligation to protect and preserve our own people against discrimination and persecution. The freedom of one minority cannot be pursued at the expense of another, and the Jews cannot be made the sacrifice of appeasement to maintain a riot-free city. After having lost six million of our brethren while the world stood silently by, we dare not remain silent in the face of rising Anti-Semitism.

The Rabbi's assistant delivered the sermon using a microphone although one was completely unnecessary and almost punctured my eardrum while speaking about people not listening.

If it appears that I am prejudiced and unable to adopt a new synagogue you are probably right: be it ever so humble there's no place like LINCOLN SQUARE SYNAGOGUE.

I accuse the City of New York of not giving Jewish store-keepers adequate protection from looters acting in flagrant violation of all ethical and civil codes.

I accuse the City of New York aiding towards the conspiracy of silence about Synagogue bombings and similar anti-Semitic activities.

I accuse the City of New York of acquiescing to the control of at least one Public School by a group of unprincipled bigots who write anti-Semitic death-threats to Jewish teachers and principals, and were not apprehended and punished for their actions.

I accuse New York University of hiring a malevolent anti-Semitic militant and of firing him without adequately condemning his anti-Semitic articles and lectures.

Every major Jewish organization and every Jew in New York must make City Hall understand that it won't happen here—at least not if we have anything to say about it!

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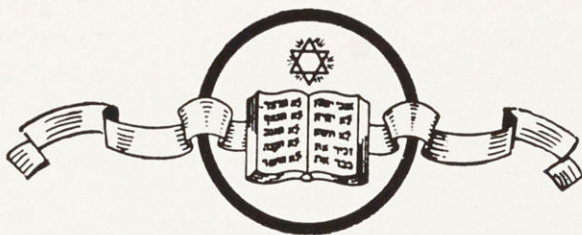
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Adult Education Institute

One of the traditional names for a Synagogue is a *bet haMidrash*, a House of Study, and the term Rabbi literally means teacher. It is because of this fact that the most important activity of L.S.S. is the study of Torah, for adults as well as for children. In addition to a flourishing Hebrew School (eighty strong) and a daily Nursery School, every Prayer Service is highlighted with study.
