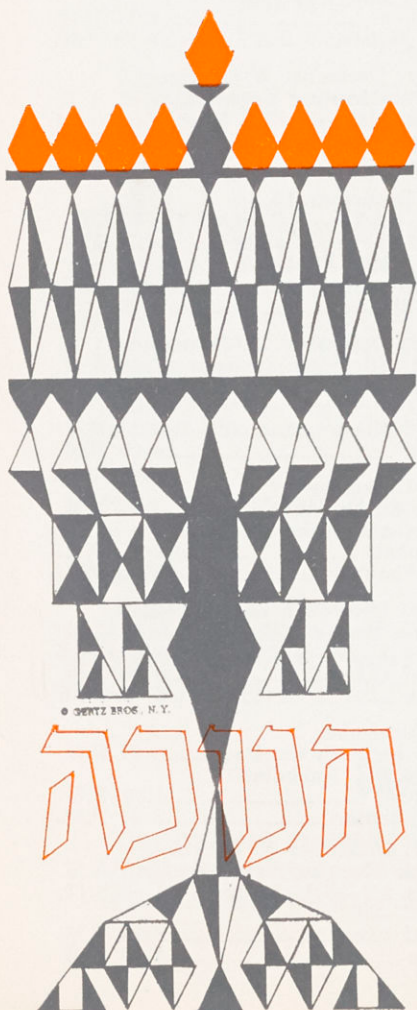

From The Rabbi's Desk...

Chanukah is generally regarded as the commemoration of the victory of a small band of Maccabees (Jewish nationalists) over the powerful forces of the pagan Greek-Syrians. This, however, is a rather simplistic re-writing of Jewish history. Actually, the residents of Judea were involved in an internal struggle concerning the direction of Israel and her relation to the Hellenistic world. The family of High Priests had decided that Judaism was an antiquated life-style, primitive in comparison to the enlightened Greek philosophy. Circumcision was an abomination which distorted the natural perfection of the human body. Man, not God, was to be viewed as the measure of all things. Indeed, Judea was to be transformed into a Greek City-State, with olympic games, fine gymnasias and philosophic cultural activities.

Many religious Judeans bitterly opposed these religious reforms and since the Olympic games were dedicated to a pagan god, they believed these activities to be strictly forbidden. The Jewish universe is *theocentric* (God-centered) rather than *anthropocentric* (man-centered), and by means of divine law man must work to perfect himself. "Walk before me and you shall become pure," teaches the Almighty. (This verse is recited as the prelude to the rite of circumcision.) To paraphrase Heinrich Heine, if the Greeks believed in the sanctity of the beautiful, the Hebrews insisted upon the beauty of the sacred. Judea must lead the world back to God, and to accomplish this aim must remain true to the eternal law of Israel.

This Kulturkampf erupted into a Civil War, with Antiochus and his cohorts supporting the Hellenists of Judea. The victory of the Maccabees was more than a military or nationalistic one; it secured the primacy of Torah for Israel for many generations to come. It is for this reason that the Menorah—the symbol of the light of Jewish law—is the hallmark of Chanukah, a festival as contemporary as today's *New York Times* or tomorrow's *Maariv*.

Chanukah Law and Lore

1. Chanukah

Chanukah Means Rededication, for it was on the twenty-fifth of Kislev that the Jews rededicated their Temple which had been defiled by the Greek-Syrians. After a miraculous battle against overwhelming odds which was incited by devastating anti-Jewish decrees, the Maccabees led the Jews to a victorious rekindling of the Menorah in the Holy Temple.

2. The Kindling of the Menorah.

In thanksgiving and commemoration, we kindle one candle on the first night of Chanukah (Thursday Evening, November 30) and add a candle each night until we have eight lit candles on the last night of the holiday (Thursday Evening, December 7). The candles are placed in the Menorah from the left and are kindled from left to right. The count does not include the shamas, the candle which lights the others.

It is preferable to place the Menorah on the window-sill in order to "publicize the miracle." One should endeavor to kindle the Chanukah lights at the time of the coming out of the stars, but many still kindle them as long as there are people walking in the street or awake in the household. On Friday evening, however, one must kindle the Chanukah lights *before* the Sabbath candles, and should use candles which are large enough to burn for thirty minutes after the coming out of the stars.

Before Kindling the Chanukah Candles, the following blessings are recited:

Baruch Ata Ado-nay, Elo-henu Melech Ha-Olam, Asher Kidshanu Bemitzvotav Vetsivanu Lehadlik Ner Shel Chanukah.

Baruch Ata Ado-nay, Elo-heyn Melech Ha-Olam, She-asa Nissim La-votenu Ba-Yamim Ha-hem Ba-Zman Ha-Zeh.

Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who has sanctified us with Thy commandments and has commanded us to Kindle the Chanukah Lights. Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who has performed miracles for our fathers in those days at this time.

On the first night only we recite also:

Baruch Ata Ado-nay, Elo-henu Melech Ha-Olam, She-hechyanu Ve-kimanu Ve-higianu La-Zman Ha-Zeh.

Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who has enabled us to live and reach this time of celebration.

3. Latkes.

There is an interesting legend that Judith killed a Greek general after putting him to sleep with the aid of warm milk and latkes. Enjoy the latkes, but don't overeat!

4. Dreidel.

The proverbial top goes round and round, and so does the destiny of the Jewish people. Children and adults alike have all spun the dreidel to the words: Nes Gadol Haya Sham, a great Miracle happened there. This game inaugurated the acceptance of light gambling only on Chanukah.

"Neshomo"

A recording of Jewish music without a clarinet to be heard? A cantor performing without a single cantorial piece in his repertoire? An album cover for a Jewish disc with no one wearing a tie? Hard to believe — but absolutely true.

The album is *NESHOMO*, recorded by our very own Sherwood Goffin. Producer Arthur Aaron managed to recruit top musicians, artists who have accompanied such un-Jewish greats as the Beatles, the Carpenters, and Blood, Sweat and Tears. They certainly rise to the occasion, though, in providing an excellent musical backdrop which artfully synthesizes Jewish 'soul' and the latest in rock. A case in point is "Tayn Shabbat, an Israeli song of hope for Sabbath peace in Jerusalem, where the artist gives meaning to the serious words while still retaining the lilt which the accompaniment reflects.

The soft-pedal is most certainly around, too. "Hatov," an old favorite of the Bostoner Rebbe, is back in its original — and preferable — form. The Yiddish melody "Torah iz di Beste S'chorah", is touching and sweet, and a tradition-breaking "Hu Elokenu" has a fresh modern sound. The title song, "Neshomo" is another original composition reflective of Sherwood's Friday evenings with the Bostoner Rebbe. It is a number which jumps from the disc into the heart and soul of the listener. On the up-beat side there is a John Philip Sousa-y "Boruch Hamokom," and "Yom

Shekulo Shabbos", a real "zinger" in the country-western mode.

The album with cover notes by Rabbi Riskin—concludes with "Horachaman", a spirited piece heralding the coming of the Messianic era, a time we hope when all Jewish music will reach the level of Sherwood Goffin's "*NESHOMO*."

2.) January 17, 7:30 P.M.: "Me and the Colonel," starring the inimitable Danny Kaye, in English in one of his funniest and most sensitive roles. It tells the story of a little unimpressive Polish Jew who maneuvers a big and important Polish Colonel into engineering his flight from the Nazis. If you're a Danny-fan, it's a must. If you're interested in psychology, it's a must. If you are interested in the history of that dreadful moment in middle Europe, it's a must. If you're interested in film-history, it's a must. It's funny! It's truth!

3.) January 24, 7:30 P.M.: "Laughter thru Tears" is based on Sholom Aleichem's "Mottele Peyser, the Cantor's Son." It's a poignant and amusing story of the Shtetl. The acting by the Yiddish Art Theatre Group is superb. It is in Yiddish with English subtitles. Another great film!

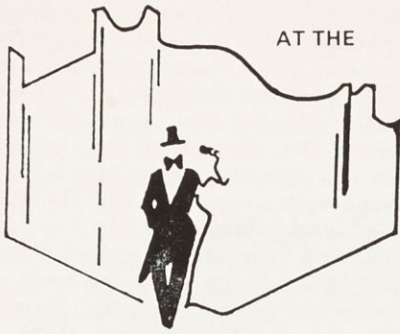
