FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

It started at morning minyan a few days before Yom Kippur. Danny Mars, the founder of Lincoln Square Synagogue and our first president approached me and asked if we had a free service on Yom Kippur as we do on Rosh Hashanah and if not, could he arrange one? A little background: legend has it that Danny decided to found this shul when he was refused admittance at a local temple on Yom Kippur because he hadn't bought a ticket. Under those circumstances, how could I refuse Danny's request? Danny, Rabbi Berman, Rabbi Katz, Rabbi Brander & Suri Kasirer swung into action: machzorim were borrowed, funds were raised, chairs were rented, publicity was prepared, and Lincoln Square Synagogue hosted one of the most extra-ordinary events in its history. As we arrived for Kol Nidre services we were greeted by hundreds of people trying to get into the bank for the L.S.S. Free Yom Kippur service. We accommodated between three and four hundred people throughout Yom Kippur due to the tireless effort of Danny, Rabbi Brander and their volunteers.

I received a number of letters from attendees. One summed it up: "thank you for opening your doors to us so gracefully."

He said he had walked five miles to be able to hear Rabbi Berman and we all benefitted by hearing both of them....Finally we have arranged two very special concerts for the coming year. On March 8, we will be hosting a very momentous evening in honor of Cantor Sherwood Goffin on the occasion of his being awarded a lifetime contract by our congregation. And, this month, on Saturday evening, November 29th, we will be sponsoring a melave malkah featuring Cantor Avshalom Katz from Los Angeles. Avshalom, who lived on the West Side for many years and often davened for us in the summers, is one of the special interpreters of Chassidic, liturgical, and current Israeli songs, especially the songs of Naomi Shemer. Being able to offer concerts by Sherwood Goffin and Avshalom Katz is to offer our members and friends the very finest in inspirational Jewish music.

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

SHAYMOTE

The Unknown Mitzvah

Texts or their photocopies which contain the name of God written in Hebrew or transliterated into another language from Hebrew (prayer books, bibles, etc.) are SHAYMOTE. They have a special sanctity and are to be treated with care. When these texts are no longer useable they must be buried. On November 23rd, Mitzvah Day, please bring SHAYMOTE to the Synagogue so that they may be buried and not disposed of in an improper manner. There is no blessing associated with the disposal of SHAYMOTE.

However, the law of SHAYMOTE does not apply to the name of God translated into languages other than Hebrew, or to texts where the sanctity of God's name was not intended (a newspaper) or was not sanctified (missionary material). These texts can be disposed of in any manner.

No single event can possibly capture the unique character of LSS. However, two events taking place in November help frame some of our most distinctive characteristics.

On Sunday, November 23, 1986 from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m., our Annex will reverberate with the sounds of Mitzvot. We will have the opportunity to see and to show our children Soferim checking Tefillin and Mezzuzot, the processes of Kashering and immersing utensils, the process of checking garments for Shaatnes. The central quality of that experience will be "Ivdu et Hashem besimcha" - "worship the Lord in joy". That day will express our commitment to the details of Mitzvot as a source of enrichment and joy in our lives.

On Sunday, November 16, 1986 at 4 p.m., our synagogue in cooperation with other orthodox synagogues on the West side will sponsor a concert in benefit of the Midtown Board of Kashruth, Hatzoloh, and the Mid Manhattan Mikvah. Our vital participation in this concert will serve to demonstrate the deep commitment which we have to provide those essential services which make our community healthy and vibrant. I urge each one of you to give your full support to this effort.

Together these two events represent our commitment to both the inner and outer needs of religious identity. The inner spiritual force which is nourished from the doing of Mitzvot must be enhanced by the existence of the outer communal structures which serve to sustain religious energy.

MITZVAH SUPERMARKET AT L.S.S.

As we approach the door, we see a Mezuzah attached to the doorpost. To the passer-by it means that a Jew resides in this house. But on a deeper level, it signifies that God is a welcome guest to this home. A Mezuzah is placed not only on the front door but on every room in the house that has a lintel and two doorposts (except the bathroom). God is not only welcome at our front door but into every room of the home and into every area of our life. Mezuzah is a constant reminder of our continuing commitment to God in our kitchen (laws of Kashruth), in our bedroom (the laws of family purity) and in our living room (laws of inter personal relationships).

Throughout this series of articles one theme should emerge - the Jew's role in sanctifying the physical world - through the laws of Shatnes even a garment has holiness, through immersing pots, pans, dishes and flatware in a mikvah, our table (the altar) is set aside for the holy act of eating, a service to God, through putting on tefillin that contain parchments of the Torah, the physical sanctity of the body.

Mezuzah serves as a constant reminder of man's role in sanctifying the physical world.

In Deuteronomy 6:9 and 11:20 the Torah commands "And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

The Mezuzah is placed on the Right Hand Doorpost as you enter the room in the top 1/3 of the doorpost and the Mezuzah should slant from top left to bottom right, and the blessing that is recited before affixing the Mezuzah is - "Baruch Atta Hashem Elokenu Melech Haolam Asher Kiddishanu Bemitzvotav Vetzivanu 'LIK-BO-AH ME-ZU-ZAH'".

The Parchment or Klaf must be hand written for use as a Mezuzah and should be purchased through a dealer that is approved by the Synagogue Rabbis.

There are many parchments available on the market which are invalid because they are photocopied, or poorly written. Even if you purchase a valid parchment the letters can fade or crack after a few years. The Klaf should be checked by a competent scribe twice in a seven year period. The last time we sponsored a campaign here at Lincoln Square Synagogue to check Mezuzot, over 80% were found to be invalid.

I urge you to bring your Mezuzot to be checked on Sunday, November 23rd between 10:00-4:00 PM. A team of reliable Sofrim (Scribes) will be on hand to inspect them. Should you find out that your Mezuzot are not Kosher you will be able to purchase new ones at that time. This is a critically important matter. I look forward to seeing you there.

Get on-the-spot answers from our Rabbis on what's kosher and what's not, and how to deal with kitchen mix-ups. (No charge)

Yes, it's time to have them checked again (it must be done twice in every seven years). All mezzuzot will be checked on the spot, reservations preferred, tefillin only by prior reservation (use the form below). You'll be able to buy new mezzuzot and tefillin parts if you need them. (Mezzuzot: members \$1, non-members \$2. Tefillin: members \$25, non-members \$30)

TEVILAT KELIM

New dishes, pots and utensils must be immersed in the mikveh before use. Buses will take you and your load from LSS to the mikveh and back (every hour on the hour). (No charge)

SHEMOT DEPOSITORY

Gather those tattered siddurim, odd pages printed with the Divine name, etc., and bring them in so that they can be properly disposed of according to halachah. (No charge)

"MIKVEH, MARRIAGE AND MAZEL TOV"

An 18-minute film which explains what the mikveh is for, who should use it, when and why (continuous showings). (No charge)

SHAATNES TESTING

Bring any new (or not-so-new) clothes that have not yet been tested for shaatnes (wool and linen) to be sure they do not contain this Biblically prohibited mixture. (Members \$5 per item or suit, non-members \$7)

KASHERING UTENSILS

Any pots or flatware whose kosher status may be doubtful through previous use or error will be made kosher on the spot (wherever possible). See a 22-minute video, "How to Kasher a Kitchen and Why"
