We hope they were imaginative and informative and less opinionated than the passage of time would now indicate. Each discussion seemed then appropriate in its time and setting. But we certainly did not delve, at least in any recognizable depth, into the merits and worth of the readers of the column - the members and friends of our Young Israel.

We have, or, rather, we are, a group that is conspicuous by its unheralded acts of thunderous accomplishment. As a group, we are counted and recognized to be a strong link in the larger community chain of supportive effort toward our brethren everywhere.

Each in our group, because he or she is a Young Israelite or a sympathetic friend to the Young Israel movement, is imbued with the spirit of sacrifice, dedication and giving. It is a basic tenet upon which we, as the children of Abraham, were weaned. This natural unity has been our strength through the ages. It sustains us now. May it carry us forward with unabated vigor, and with accelerating force, to the end of time.
