Summertime is the time of year when the pace of life seems to slow down. Its long days allow us an opportunity to sit back and breathe deeply. Questions and Answers on The High Holy Days

- Q. What do the words "Rosh Hashanah" mean?
- A. Beginning of the year (literally Head of the year").
- Q. When is Rosh Hashanah observed?
- A. On the first day of Tishri, seventh month in the Hebrew calendar.
- Q. By what three names is Rosh Hashanah known?
- A. Day of Judgment (Yom Hadin). Day of Remembering (Yom Hazikaron), and Day of Blowing the Shofar (Yom T'ruah).
- Q. By what Hebrew name is the person who blows the Shofar known?
- A. "Baal Tokeah."
- Q. Name three occasions in the life of the Jewish people on which the Shofar was sounded in ancient times.
- A. To announce the new moon and festivals, to proclaim the jubilee or year of release, to issue a call to battle, to communicate tidings of victory.
- Q. What special greeting do worshippers extend to each other at the end of the Service, on the eve of Rosh Hashanah?
- A. L'shono Tovah Tikosevu V'sechosemu (May you be inscribed and sealed for a happy year).
- Q. What custom is observed at the evening meal of Rosh Hashanah?
- A. It is customary to partake of sweet fruit dipped in honey.

The World And You

Every deed tips the scale either towards oblivion or salvation. Such is the tremendous effect of every individual's act, purgatory or paradise, for himself and mankind.

How? Every man has it in his power to influence the character and quality of *his* family, of *his* associates, of *his* community, and above all of *himself*. The city or the state is the product of every man's deliberate choice. Let us begin in our own homes to mend our own fences and it will not be too long before the care and impact will be felt in the larger circles of human interplay. A kind word, a meaningful smile, a warm handshake, a helpful gesture, cause untold favorable reactions.

A Rabbi on his death bed wept. Why? Because he had spent the major portion of his life trying to change the world, the country, the community. He failed. Only at the end of his life, he realized that it would have been much more beneficial for all if he had devoted more time to the improving of himself and his immediate beloved ones. Let us improve our own self and the world will be a better one for all.

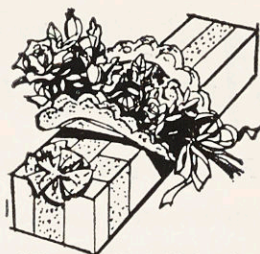

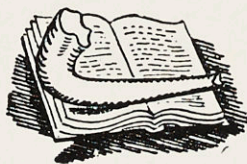
