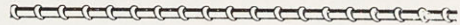
We also had the pleasure of having Pauline Lehman attend and do hope she will be feeling well enough to attend more of our meetings and functions.

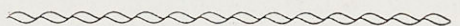

Men's Club

From the President

As the President of the Men's Club, I considered it my privilege to share with my members information regarding world news, mainly Jewish oriented as well as that pertaining to Jewish personalities. In last month's bulletin I described Dr. Theodore Herzl as the founder of the Zionist movement — the Jewish liberation movement. Now I will picture him as an individual, husband and father.

Theodor Herzl was born in Budapest in an assimilated family that actually had no bonds with Judaism. During his younger years he was by profession a journalist and a writer for the theatre. The delegates who came to the first Zionist Congress described him as a King. It is worthwhile to note that once when Herzl appeared on the streets of Wilno — a Russian city, he was met by thousands of people who shouted "*YECHI HAMELECH*" *long live the King*.

His personal family life belongs among the most tragic human dramas. At the age of 27 he fell in love with the 18-year-old daughter of a wealthy Jewish industrialist. At that time he was a writer of light stories and comedies. Because of the success of one of his comedies on the theatre stage, the parents of the young lady consented to the marriage. Four years later he was already the father of two daughters and one son. Due to his wife's suicidal tendencies there were many painful scenes. However, he found satisfaction in his political life.

Herzl died in 1909 at the age of 44. He was buried in Jerusalem next to the graves of his parents and young sister. His wife died four years later at the age of 39. His older daughter Pauline, was always ailing and at the age of 40 took an overdose of heroin and died.

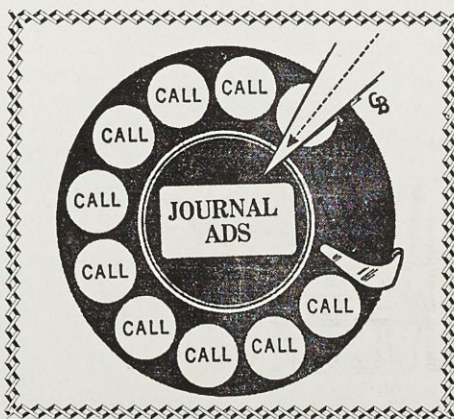
His son Hans was invited by his father's closest friend Wolpon, also a very dedicated Zionist leader, to stay with him in London. Hans was studying in school but had the same mental problems as his sister. When he learned of his sister's death he also committed suicide.

His younger daughter Trudeau married the industrialist Newman and gave birth to a son Stephan Theodore. In 1943 she was taken captive by the Nazis and after long suffering she died. Her son was the only one left in the Herzl family. He lived in England and in the Second World War he was an officer in the British army.

In 1946 he visited Palestine and was greeted profusely by the settlers as the grandson of the greatest leader. He was impressed by the honor and promised to return and live in Jerusalem. In 1946 he went to Washington, where he served in the British Embassy, but in the same year he jumped off a bridge to his death.

This was the last chapter of Theodor Herzl as the father.
