With tongue in cheek . . . How to Run Your Synagogue Without Dues

We have finally found a way for a Synagogue to function without money.

Those who do not wish to support the Synagogue to the extent of their ability will be greatly pleased by the following recommendations which if adopted will cost them \$0.00 annually.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Each member will come to Service dressed in such a way as to eliminate any necessity for heating or cooling the building.
- 2. Each member will take his turn preaching, leading the services, and teaching our adults and youth. Then no rabbis, cantors or teachers will be needed.
- 3. Each member will come to Synagogue with grass-cutters, brooms, dustmops, floorwaxes, waterbuckets and rags to keep his part of the building presentable. Each will be called upon regularly to clean up the kitchen, wash the dishes, set up and take down tables and folding chairs after each assembly, social hour or dinner, and dispose of all wastepaper. Thus, paid custodians will not be necessary.
- 4. Each member will bring tools and materials to remodel, repair and repaint the building. Here we can really save money.
- 5. Those who wish to use water will bring their own bottles. They will also bring their own candles to eliminate the use of electricity and evening functions and services.
- 6. Each will provide his own Prayer Book and Tallis.
- 7. All requests for service information from the Synagogue office will be made in person so as to eliminate telephone bills.
- 8. Each member will spend some time working in the synagogue office. If one desires a copy of the synagogue bulletin, he will bring his own supplies for duplicating same. This will eliminate the expense of office help and office equipment.

- 9. Each member will take his turn as Educational Director and secretary. This too will save money.
- 10. Each member will take his turn preaching, reading the services, reading the Torah, teaching Adult Education classes, conducting funerals, performing marriages, calling on members, visiting the sick, consoling mourners, handling correspondence, counseling other members on personal problems, preparing programs, planning activities and guiding the administration of the Synagogue. This will save the expenses of any professional staff.

A Much Shorter Version

- 1. BECOME A JEWISH SCHOLAR. Any knowledgeable Jew can lead and perform the rituals. Thus, no paid staff no dues!
- 2. LIVE AS A SAINT. Saints don't need the facilities of organized religion. No institution no need for money!
