TU BISHEVAT

Tu Bishevat (the 15th day of the month of Shevat) is a semi-holiday or minor holiday, but a very important one in the life of the Jewish people. Although there is no law which commands us to observe this holiday, we all gladly do so because we love it and what it stands for.

Tu Bishevat is the festival when nature in Israel is reborn. To the Chalutzim (Pioneers) in Eretz Yisroel it is the time to buy land, sow seeds, plant trees and start work for the coming year. They are kept busy draining swamps, plowing the soil, planting the fields and forests, building new settlements, and in, general, proving to the world that Jews can live a full and happy life on the land of their forefathers.

To the Jewish people everywhere, Tu Bishevat is a symbol of spring and hope, rebirth and joy in nature. It brings with it not only beautiful thoughts but also beautiful deeds.

It makes us realize how rich and bountiful is the world God has created, how grateful we should be for all the wonderful growing things He has surrounded us with and how sacred and holy is every living thing. We learn from this holiday that we must treat with care and consideration not only the people who live around us, but also the trees, fruits and flowers, the fields and the orchards. Our Rabbis said: "It is forbidden to dwell in a town where there are no gardens" and "Just as others planted for you, so shall you plant for the sake of your children."

The planting of a tree, is considered a great mitzvah (virtue), while the cutting down of a fruit tree is forbidden by Jewish law, except in certain special cases — for instance, if it grows on the spot where a home has to be built. Nothing God has created must be destroyed by us except when it is urgently needed to serve some very important purpose.
