Cannot that grim nightmare of the World War compel these dictators to capture some fugitive glimpse of the real perspective of life, peering through the eyes of religion? Can they not see that the future records of history will regard their triumph as injustice and inequity? The vision of Isaiah is needed, that vision of peace motivated by an impulse toward godliness in which "nation shall not raise sword against nation, nor shall they learn war any more."
