Rabbi Lookstein Addresses Purim Gathering

Despite the very inclement weather on Tuesday, a most representative group met in the Social Hall of the synagogue for the Purim gathering of the Greater New York Council of the Women's Branch of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America. Rabbi Lookstein was the guest speaker of the afternoon, and in his address the Rabbi stressed the necessity for Hebrew education for girls, emphasizing in particular the need for support of the Hebrew Teacher's Training School for Girls. So forceful was the appeal, that the organization, through its President, Mrs. Jacob Marcuson, pledged ever-increasing support of and cooperation to the Training School. Mrs. Cave, a representative of the United Jewish Appeal spoke of the urgent need for funds for the amelioration of conditions here and abroad for our suffering brethren. There followed a short skit by two members of the Habanoth, coached by Mrs. Stern and then a group of junior Habanoth presented an original operetta, written by one of the cast, fourteen year-old Jessie Chanine, and very ably coached by Mrs. Julius Dukas, depicting the story of Purim. Delicious refreshments, with the Sisterhood of Kehilath Jeshurun as the hostesses were served at the end of the program.
