SPECIAL SIMHATH TORAH SERVICE ARRANGED Men's Club and Sisterhood to Participate

A Simhath Torah service of unusual charm and impressiveness has been arranged for Monday night, October 13th in which the Men's Club, the Sisterhood and Ramaz children and parents will participate.

The synagogue will be especially decorated with Hebrew and American flags in honor of the holiday and of Columbus Day. The principal guests of course will be the children of our members and seatholders for whom, as usual, a special section will be reserved. They will be provided with flags and sweets by the Sisterhood.

The service proper, as arranged by the Rabbi, will be read by the Cantor. Special songs of a religious and national character have been prepared. The climax of the service will be at the closing when after Adon Olam is chanted, the entire congregation will sing "God Bless America." A printed Order of Service will be in the hands of every worshipper.
