Rabbi Lookstein Broadcasts To Russia

Last Sunday Rabbi Lookstein spoke over station WMCA, on a National Hook-up, which was rebroadcast to Russia. The program was arranged as a form of response to the call issued by Russian Jews to World Jewry. Up to now there were responses from Chief Rabbi Isaac Herzog of Palestine and Chaim Weitzman of England. For American Jewry there were four speakers, amongst whom was our own Rabbi.

Rev. Dr. John P. Boland, prominent Catholic Clergyman and appointee of Gov. Herbert H. Lehman to the Chairmanship of the State Labor Relations Board, will be the next speaker of the Men's Club Forum on the evening of Wednesday, November 12th, in the Social Hall.

Dr. Boland has held many important Catholic Pastorates. Early in his career his social outlook won recognition and won him appointments as Judge of the Matrimonial Court of the Diocese of Buffalo, Vice-President of the National Catholic Industrial Conference and Director of the Catholic Labor College. More recently he has been Professor of Labor Relations at Fordham University. He is the author of "Ethics of Wages," "Labor Relations and Papal Encyclicals," and many others too numerous to mention.

Dr. Boland's subject for the Forum will be, **"Labor Has Many Duties."** There is a real treat in store for those who attend. Put the date of November 12th in your diary.
