Academy Registration Increases

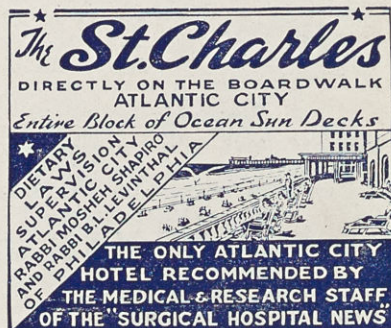
