A Special Appeal to Women

Continuing in the spirit of the appeal that the Rabbi made before the Sisterhood, he is again urging the women of the congregation to attend Saturday services.

"There are three things that every-one of us ought to do these days," said the Rabbi, "and they are fight, work, pray. Women are relieved of the first. Not all of them have been asked to do the second. No one is exempt from the third."

The Rabbi's appeal continues. "Women, all that we ask is to give God an hour or an hour and a half once a week. Come and let us pray together for our country, for your sons who are in the service or will soon be in the service and for the sons of all mothers who are fighting in the armed forces of our country.

"I shall look for you in the synagogue this Sabbath and every Sabbath for the duration."
