Rabbi Continues Sermon Series

In his sermon last Saturday the Rabbi discussed three approaches to the Jewish problem. The first was suggested by an article in the Atlantic Monthly by Albert Jay Nock, the second was made by Jerome Frank and the third by Prof. Rheinhold Niebuhr.

The Rabbi stressed especially the contribution of Prof. Niebuhr who opposes the melting pot idea. Cultural imperialism, he said, is as dangerous as any other kind of imperialism and democracy is not democracy unless it allows for the development of a multiplicity of cultures side by side.

What the non-Jewish world calls the melting-pot, the Jewish world calls assimilation, the Rabbi said. The assimilationist who seeks the obliteration of Judaism and its absorption by the dominant culture, knows little of Judaism and even less of Americanism. One can serve America best by preserving the identity and creativeness of each individual culture and contributing the gifts of each culture to the totality of American civilization.

This Saturday the Rabbi will continue the discussion by taking as his subject "What is Judaism — Race, Creed or Nationality?" Those who were present last week will not want to miss this week's discourse. Please come on time and be in your seats before eleven o'clock.

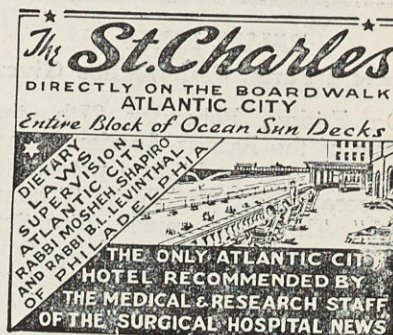
