RABBI PRESENTS BLUEPRINT FOR FUTURE ACTIVITIES

At the Board of Trustees meeting last Thursday night, Rabbi Lookstein presented a comprehensive plan of future activities to which the Board listened with great interest. The plan covered an evaluation of our congregational past and a long range view of the future. It suggested a rethinking of the scope and objectives of the congregation, as well as a revision of its financial structure.

The Board of Trustees will now study the plan and prepare for its proper implementation.

DO YOU KNOW YOUR PRAYER BOOK?

Are you familiar with the Jewish prayer book? Are you acquainted with the meaning and significance of some of the important prayers? Do you know why, when and by whom they were composed?

Beginning with next Saturday afternoon, Rabbi Lookstein will deliver a series of discourses on the general subject of the Jewish Prayer Book. In a sense this series is the

result of numerous requests made by those who heard the Rabbi's discourses on the Kaddish which were delivered on five successive weeks on Saturday afternoons.

These discourses follow mincha services and last for a half year. It is even planned that a question and answer period will follow the regular discourse. Men and women are invited.
