A Permanent War Record on Casualties and Awards

Our Mr. H. I. Bucher, in cooperation with the National Jewish Welfare Board, is compiling a permanent record of all congregants and their relatives in service who are:

1. Killed or died of wounds
2. Died of disease or accident
3. Wounded
4. Missing
5. Prisoner

Also, the names of those individuals who have received awards or decorations are likewise being recorded. Further included as eligibles to this list are Men's Club and Sisterhood members, as well as seatholders and their relatives. It is most essential that each of us concerned send in the names of those eligible, if a complete statistical chart of Jewish participation in this war is to be properly presented to posterity. Needless to say, this is a very important work. Please send all information to the synagogue office, care of H. I. Bucher.

Chanukah In Your Home

The Chanukah Festival will be ushered in on Sunday night with the lighting of the first Chanukah candle. It will continue for eight days, on each night of which an additional light is kindled. The holiday commemorates the heroism of the Maccabees of old who vanquished their Syrian-Greek oppressors in the year 165 B.C.E.

Make Chanukah a home festival. Gather your children about you at the kindling of the lights. Sing with them the traditional holiday songs. Remember them and teach them to remember you with holiday gifts. Yes, include some typical holiday dishes during the course of the week. In a word, make Chanukah meaningful and significant to yourself and to your family. Impress upon them that the spirit of Jewish heroism still lives. In the ghetto of Warsaw, in the concentration camps of Europe, our heroic spirit was tested. In the glory of Palestine and in the renaissance of Jewish life and culture, that spirit is triumphant.

Transmit this spirit to your children, and as the tiny flame of the Chanukah candle sputters yet glistens, make them understand that the message it conveys
