Tens of thousands of Jews may be saved from the hellhole of Europe through underground methods of relief. Thousands of little children can be rescued. There is an agency that does this rescue work, the Vaad Hahatzala.

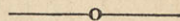

Of course, a small contribution is also welcome. We ask our generous friends, however, to bear in mind the several causes in behalf of which we are appealing. They will then give as they indeed know how to give.

May we make the following suggestions: 1) Please send your contribution immediately. 2) Try to make the minimum gift "Chi" or \$18. The symbolic figure which means life, will bring life to many a despairing soul.
