

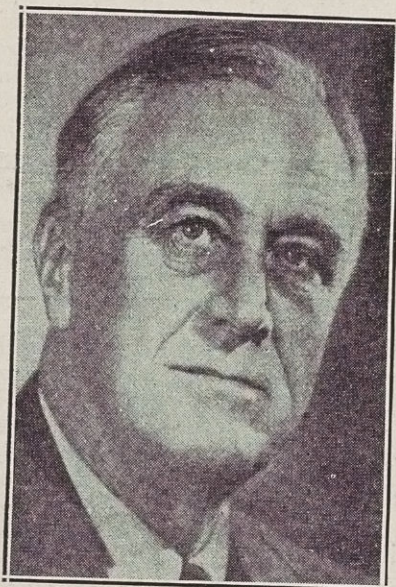

ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL SERVICES

Our synagogue was filled last Saturday with a congregation of men and women who came to pay tribute to our departed President. There was sorrow in every face, prayers and tears came easily.

Rabbi Lookstein delivered a moving address of tribute. He said in part: "He who could not stand without support was able to have an entire world lean on him. He who was deprived of the ability to walk could nevertheless make all humanity progress steadily toward its appointed destiny. Alas, that one who led the way to the promised land was deprived of entering it. Such was the fate of the great lawgiver of our people; such, too, is the fate of him whom we mourn profoundly, whom we shall remember eternally."

Because of Sabbath and Rosh Chodesh, no formal memorial prayers could be offered. The congregation rose before the open Ark and observed a moment of silent prayer.

A memorial assembly was also held by the children of Ramaz School on Friday. The children were visibly affected and many of the older ones

had tears in their eyes, as Mr. Joseph E. Adler chanted taps. To the children, Rabbi Lookstein explained the love that President Roosevelt had for the youth of the country. He spoke also of the example that he set as one who overcame every physical handicap and every obstacle of infirmity.

Together with all synagogues of the country, Kehilath Jeshurun observed the traditional week of mourning and prayer for our late President.

RABBI LOOKSTEIN TO ATTEND SAN FRANCISCO CONFERENCE
