**MAX LERNER THRILLS
THANKSGIVING AUDIENCE**

Close to a thousand people filled the main floor of the Synagogue and the Balcony at our Thanksgiving service Thursday, November 22nd. The guest speaker was the outstanding journalist and author, Max Lerner, whose subject was: "Where Do We Go from War?"

In a profound and forceful address that lasted over one hour, Mr. Lerner analyzed the general disillusionment in the present post-war period and the problems that confront us in our efforts for world peace. In answer to his topic question, Mr. Lerner asserted that although victory has been achieved by our armed forces, the war is not yet over. We are now engaged in a bitter struggle against intolerance, lust for power and international immorality—the very evils that brought on the fascist menace and the World War. He cited the British policy toward Palestine as an example of broken promises, and called Bevin's recent statement an immoral act. The only hope for a lasting peace lies in a united world based on the principles of true democracy.

The musical part of the service was rendered by Cantor Victor Gold, assisted by Machtenberg's Choir.

The Thanksgiving services were inspiring as well as enlightening, and certainly left a lasting impression upon all.

Dr. Janowsky Addresses November Forum

On Tuesday, November 20th, our members had the rare pleasure of listening to the eloquent and scholarly address of Dr. Oscar I. Janowsky, Professor of History at City College, who spoke on the subject: "Jewish Positions in a Changing World."

In vivid terms Dr. Janowsky portrayed the tragic plight of the Jew in war-torn Europe—his homelessness and despondency. The refugees of other nations who suffered under Hitlerism can go back to their countries and rebuild their homes, but the Jewish remnant that escaped annihilation has no country and no home. Even in such countries as France and Czechoslovakia, anti-Semitism has raised its ugly head. With the gates of the democracies barred, the Jewish refugee has only one hope, and that is Palestine—the only country that can take him, and wants to take him. Dr. Janowsky urged greater unity in Jewish ranks in pressing their demands for the abrogation of the White Paper, and free immigration into Palestine. "Let the doors be opened, and a Jewish Commonwealth will ultimately be realized."

After the question and answer period, Rabbi Lookstein commented briefly on the subject and thanked Dr. Janowsky for his admirable presentation.

As usual, the audience partook of the refreshments which were served through the generosity of Sam Bucher.
