After a lapse of seven weeks, I am happy to be back in your midst.

The first impulse is naturally one of gratitude to the Almighty for having watched over me during the course of my mission and for having brought me back safely to you. May He who granteth favors to all be blessed for the favors shown to me.

I have seen the continent of Europe wracked and ravaged. I have visited with men and women of our armed forces whose heroism made victory possible. I have prayed at the graves of those who made the supreme sacrifice in the service of our country. I have seen the rem-

nants of our brethren in the temporary shelters set up for them in the erstwhile lands of their affliction. I have observed our Allies in France, Belgium and Holland struggling desperately to return to normal life.

All these experiences I am anxious to share with you. I shall avail myself of the opportunity to do so in a series of three addresses beginning this Sabbath. I hope to be honored with your presence and to greet you personally on the Sabbath coming.

In the meantime let me extend to our entire congregational family the traditional greeting of "Shalom."
