MEN'S CLUB DINNER A MAGNIFICENT AFFAIR

Ira Weisman — Honored

It is difficult to refrain from the use of superlatives in describing the Sixth Annual Dinner of the Men's Club which was held, April 30th, in the Synagogue House. Those who were there, will agree that it was indeed a brilliant affair in every respect. As the outstanding social event of the year, it also proved to be an imposing testimonial to the esteem and loyalty which the organization enjoys, as well as a demonstration of affection and honor to its able leadership. Seldom does one enjoy such genuine spirit of good fellowship and fraternity as that which prevailed that evening.

The festivities began early with the serving of cocktails in the Social Hall where a splendid array of paintings was exhibited by the noted artist — our esteemed member, David Immerman. As the guests assembled, one could see among them many men of leadership and prominence in our community. We were particularly happy to greet the Honorable Stanley Fuld, who has recently been appointed Associate Justice of the Court of Appeals of the State of New York.

Dinner was served in the auditorium of the Synagogue House to the music of David Tarras and his orchestra furnished through the courtesy of our devoted member, Dr. Elihu Katz. Rabbi Lookstein pronounced the invocation and also led in the saying of grace after the dinner.

Mr. Ira F. Weisman, President of the club, extended a cordial welcome to the members and guests and voiced his appreciation to all who contributed to the success of the evening. He singled out Mr. Hyman Bucher, Chairman of the Dinner and conveyed to him the gratitude of the club for a job well done.

Mr. Weisman then introduced the

guest speaker of the evening, Mr. Basil O'Connor, distinguished attorney and law partner of our late president, Franklin Delano Roosevelt. In a profound and eloquent address, Mr. O'Connor discussed the main problems confronting the post war period, namely, the complete eradication of Hitlerism and the establishment of a new world order based on the principles of freedom and democracy. He pointed out that although Hitler had been completely defeated, the seeds of hatred and reaction which he had sown throughout the world have not as yet been destroyed. He urged the fullest cooperation of all Americans in the efforts of the United Nations through which we hope to create a safer and better world for ourselves and our children.

As is customary at most Men's Club functions, Rabbi Lookstein followed the guest speaker and in his fascinating manner commented on the main address.

The highlight of the evening was the surprise presentation of a beautiful wristwatch to Mr. Weisman, as a token of affection and esteem by the members of the organization. In making the presentation, Rabbi Lookstein paid a glowing tribute to Mr. Weisman for his indefatigable efforts and unstinted devotion in his capacity as president of the Men's Club for the past six years. Mr. Weisman was deeply moved by this outpouring of affection, and in his modest way acknowledged the gift with gratitude and appreciation.

Mr. Zevi Schooler, noted monologist, completed the evening's festivities with several humorous anecdotes and recitations. Thus, came to a close another social event which set a new record and made history for the Men's Club.
