PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL LAUNCHED

A tradition of long standing in Jewish life is to provide for those in need at Passover time. The Talmud speaks of this tradition, and communities the world over have been practicing the custom by making available a fund from which Matzoth and other Passover necessities are purchased for distribution among the poor.

RAMAZ STUDENTS AGAIN PAR-TICIPATE IN MEGILLAH READING

An innovation introduced two years ago at the Reading of the Megillah at Purim time, took a step forward toward becoming an established institution in Kehilath Jeshurun. Last Monday evening, before a congregation of men, women and children who came to usher in the Purim holiday, ten Ramaz students read, with uncommon melodiousness and perfection, the Book of Esther, to the spiritual satisfaction of everyone present.
