COLUMBIA, CORNELL, AND BARNARD ADMIT RAMAZ HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS Others Accepted by New York University, Syracuse and City Colleges Thirty Two Graduate From Elementary Department

The first graduating class of Ramaz High School has achieved a most gratifying record with respect to college admissions. Of the eleven students to be graduated, four applied for admission to private colleges. All four were admitted to the colleges of their choice. They are as follows:

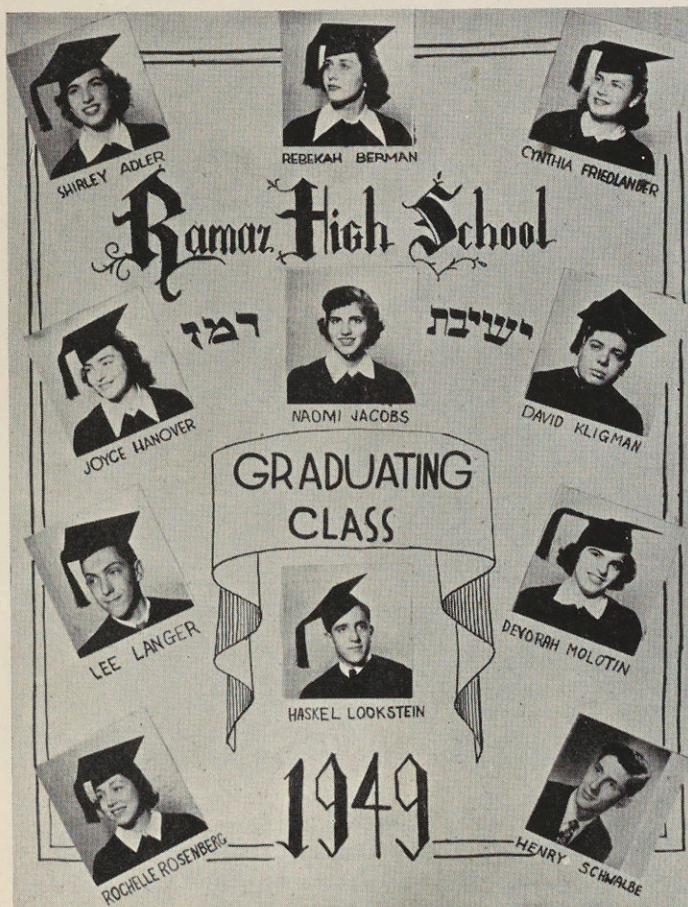

In the case of applicants to the city colleges it is interesting to note that the Ramaz students had to compete with literally thousands of graduates from the city high schools applying to these institutions. Their admission to the college of their choice, therefore, is a credit to their ability and academic attainments.

A word of comment cannot be withheld as one contemplates this fine record. Ramaz High School is only four years old. It is a newcomer in the family of secondary schools. That the graduates of this "baby" institution should receive recognition from the leading colleges and universities of the city and country is an achievement of unusual significance. It is an index of the mental calibre of the student body as well as of the educational prestige of Ramaz itself. Parents who were accustomed to think that the educational pastures of other private schools are greener ought to do some serious thinking.
