The Board of Trustees has decided to open membership in the Congregation to all unmarried ladies who want to become affiliated as members in the synagogue. This decision was prompted by the numerous requests received from lady seat-holders, members of the Sisterhood and many others, who were anxious to join us but for whom no provision was heretofore made.

It was some three years ago that the Board established what is called Special Membership, which was limited to the wives of deceased members. By broadening the scope of this category, all single ladies may now become affiliated with us at an annual dues which includes a synagogue seat for the High Holidays in addition to other membership privileges.

Interested parties are requested to contact the office, where further information may be had and application forms are available.

As expressed at the Board meeting — and at prior meetings of the Ramaz Board and the Religious School Board — this is one time when the Year Book must command the support of each and every member of the Kehilath Jeshurun Family. It is not the sole obligation of Board members, or of any single group of members. Rather it is in the interest of everybody who has Jewish education at heart. There are few mitzvahs that can compare with that of giving religious training to our next generation. And the Year Book is dedicated to just that cause.
