NEEDY AIDED BY PASSOVER RELIEF FUND

Thanks to the generous response of our members and friends, the 1950 Passover Relief Appeal realized over \$2500 — an amount which, while somewhat below our original quota, is nevertheless substantial enough to take care of the cases which we were called upon to help this year.

We know our readers will be interested in a summary of the monies received and disbursed, and so we are happy to render this brief report:

Receipts\$2561.00

Disbursements:

Yorkville Passover Relief Fund, for the aid of the needy in our community \$ 900.00

Sent to Israel, particularly for refugee relief work and institutions of Jewish learning\$ 298.00

To deserving individuals, mostly Rabbis, who would not come to the attention of public charity..\$ 325.00

Special grants to organizations doing relief, educational and philanthropic work\$ 848.00

Total disbursements\$2371.00

We think it would be proper to mention some of those organizations who are benefiting from your generosity. In Israel, they include the Mir Yeshiva, Rabbanim Plitei Hagolah, Yeshiva Sfath Emeth, the Relief Committee for Refugee Rabbis, etc., in addition to which, of course, are numerous individual rabbis and scholars whose holiday will be made happier because of your cooperation.

Among the American charities who have tasted of your kindness are the Passover Fund of the Mizrachi Organization, the Rabbinical Council of America, Esras Torah, the Rabbi Jacob Joseph School, Austro-Hungarian Free Burial Society and the Rabbinical Board of Greater New York. It is evident, thus, that your contributions were put to good use, and that many are the individuals who have, directly or indirectly, felt the results of our Appeal.

To the hundreds who responded, and they include the children of Ramaz School who contributed a substantial sum — we extend our sincerest thanks and appreciation. Theirs is the satisfaction of knowing that they have participated in one of the most important mitzvahs, for which we pray God may bless them richly.
