Address Meeting —**

As the guest speaker for the final Forum Meeting of the season, the Men's Club has invited Walter White, Executive Secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of the Colored People. Mr. White will speak on the subject, "The Color Line around the Globe."

Champion of minority rights, staunch supporter of the under-dog, Mr. White has earned a world-wide reputation for his ceaseless fight against intolerance and bigotry. He has gained recognition for his forthright stand on various aspects of the race problem and similar problems besetting the world today. A graduate of Atlanta University, he has served on many UN, State and City committees, and has been the recipient of several awards and citations for commendable service.

Mr. White has traveled extensively not only through continental United States, but also in Europe and the Orient. As a war correspondent for the **New York Post**, he visited the European, Mediterranean, Middle

East and Pacific theatres of operation in 1943-45.

Until the end of this month, Mr. White is on leave of absence from the NAACP. During this leave, he participated in the 'Round the World Town Meeting of the Air, visiting European countries, Israel, Egypt, India and Japan. He recently returned from a tour of the Caribbean region, gathering material for a forthcoming book.

An interesting and stimulating talk, given by an outstanding speaker, awaits our guests next Tuesday evening. Aside from the treat that is in store for you, you have this last opportunity to get together with "the boys" before we leave on summer vacations.

May we have the pleasure of your company — Tuesday evening, May 16th, at 8:30?
