

A Happy Purim

ALVIN JOHNSON TO BE MAIN SPEAKER AT DR. BELKIN TESTIMONIAL DINNER

Mr. Harry W. Baumgarten, chairman of the Arrangements Committee for the Testimonial Dinner which the Congregation will tender in honor of Dr. Samuel Belkin this Tuesday evening, has announced that the main speaker of the evening will be Dr. Alvin Johnson, President emeritus of the New School for Social Research. The Dinner will be cur means of paying tribute to one of our own revered trus ees, who stands at the head of a unique institution, Yeshiva University, on the occasion of the granting of a charter to the University to establish a medical school.

The announcement of Dr. Johnson's acceptance as the principal speaker next Tuesday evening, is indeed most heartening news. Dr. Johnson is an internationally-known scholar. A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Dr. Johnson served in the Spanish-American War before receiv-

ing his Ph. D. from Columbia University, and has taught at the Universities of Texas, Chicago, Cornell and his alma mater.

His crowning achievement was the founding of the New School for Social Research in 1919. He was its active president until 1945, when he became President-emeritus of that institution. In 1940, when the Nazis over-ran Europe, Dr. Johnson was mainly responsible for bringing over some 200 outstanding men and women to set up the Ecole Libre des Hautes Etudes. In this respect he is not unlike our guest of honor who will also head an educational institution in its pioneering days.

As an editor of the Encyclopaedia of Social Sciences, as the author of numerous scholarly works, and as the former editor of "New Republic" and other important periodicals and magazines, Dr. Johnson has earned for himself a niche in the intellectual world that is distinctive, and a reputation in scholastic circles that is respected.

Dr. Johnson's presence at our Dinner is just another indication of the high esteem in which Dr. Belkin is

PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL LAUNCHED

About this time of the year, Kehilath Jeshurun launches its Passover Relief Appeal, continuing a tradition of long standing in Jewish life — that of providing for those in need at Passover time. The Talmud speaks of this tradition and communities all over the globe practice the custom by making available a fund from which matzoth and other Passover necessities are purchased for distribution among the poor.

In our Congregation, this time-honored institution has always elicited a generous response. Our congregational family has, in recent years, been called upon to raise large sums at Passover time, and always have we come through.

This year, a minimum of \$5,000 will be required. This sum will be allocated along various channels. To begin with, a large part of it will go to the Yorkville Joint Passover Relief Fund, which takes care of the needy in our own immediate neighborhood. A substantial sum will go as special Passover grants to deserving institutions in America, in devastated Europe, and, particularly, in Israel. Out of this fund, too, will be taken care of respectable and deserving families about whose need we know and who do not come to the attention of public charity.

We again appeal, therefore, to all our readers — members, affiliates, seatholders, friends of Kehilath Jeshurun generally — to respond generously to our drive this year. Above all, please do not delay. Send in your contribution at once if you want it to accomplish the most good.
