

JUNIOR CONGREGATION, YOUNG PEOPLE'S MINYAN RESUME SERVICES THIS WEEK-END

The Junior Congregation will resume its weekly service this Saturday morning, November 8th, at 10:15 o'clock, in the Chapel.

We know that the youngsters who reside in our community will welcome this bit of news, for they have come to enjoy this weekly feature and to participate in it in greater numbers with every succeeding year. We are certain, too, that they will be interested in knowing that a good deal of careful study has gone into planning this year's Junior Congregation, to the end that it will be enriched to an even greater extent than in past years, and that it will bear more meaning and significance to the youngsters themselves.

Once again, Mr. Manfred Rechtschaffen will be in charge of the service. A graduate of Ramaz, Mr. Rechtschaffen is currently attending Yeshiva University, and has several years of experience in handling groups of this kind. Last year, he so popularized the activity, that our youngsters have virtually clamored for his return.

Regular attendance at the Junior Congregation has its own reward in educational and pedagogical gains. A more tangible reward to the youngsters, however, will be given for attending the service every Saturday morning. A list of prizes is being compiled so that the youngsters may choose their own gift after having attended a certain number of weeks. This, in addition to the kiddush that follows the service every Saturday.

Marking the fifth year of its existence, the Young People's Minyan will begin its weekly services for the coming year this Sunday morning, November 9th, at 9:30 o'clock, in the Chapel.

For the benefit of those who may not be familiar with the content of this activity — as well as for those who may have forgotten what it consists of — we review briefly the program of the Minyan on a typical Sunday morning: first there is the service, conducted by the young people themselves. The service usually includes a brief sermon delivered by one of the youthful congregants on an interesting and timely topic. After services, a community breakfast is served — Sunday morning fare that can't be beat! During the breakfast, a general discussion frequently takes place in round-table fashion. Then, the young men adjourn to the gymnasium where they partake of a game of basketball or some other athletic activity.

All in all, it is an activity that appeals to the young people, and retains their interest. Even the young man who acts as the supervisor of the Minyan, Haskel Lookstein, is "one of the boys" who is himself an alumnus of the earlier Minyan's and knows what is required by the constituents of the service.

This year we shall aim to broaden the Young People's Minyan into a Father-and-Son Minyan of the highest type. A concerted effort is being
