The festive holiday of Passover was fully celebrated by the children of our Ramaz and afternoon Religious Schools in their many classroom activities and the climax was reached in a series of Model Sedorim that attracted not only the children but many parents as well.

The spirit of Passover was felt in many ways. The lobby of our Synagogue House was gaily decorated with Passover motifs as were the classrooms and the Auditorium. The singing of "Ma Nishtana", "Echad Mi Yodea", "Dayenu" and other Seder songs could be heard all week in the classrooms and in the halls. The many sounds finally merged on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons to form the beautiful and traditional chants of the Model Sedorim.

Each Seder was opened with the singing of special songs. This was followed by the chanting of the Kiddush in the traditional melodious manner. Each class had a queen who lit the candles and a king who presided.

Tasty meals were served appropriate to the occasion and the total ceremony was a rich experience that would soon be re-enacted in the children's homes.

Truly this series of Model Sedorim proved the family spirit of the Ramaz and Religious School. The great number of parents who attended these Sedorim also went through a rich experience witnessing the religious and educational growth of their children in the beautiful setting of their school.

**AIR-CONDITIONING OF CHAPEL AND SOCIAL HALL
PROCEEDING RAPIDLY**

The loud noises of hammering and drilling that have been heard throughout our Synagogue House these past weeks may have sounded like our building was being taken apart. However, they were, on the contrary, the sounds of something important being added — our new air-conditioning system.

The unit now being installed will cover the Chapel and Social Hall, where a cooling system will add greatly to the comfort of our worshippers and our guests, and will enhance the "usability" of these beautifully-appointed rooms. The unit is so designed that it will be able to cool the Auditorium too, when its extension there is desired.

Work on the air-conditioning has been proceeding rapidly and we look forward to its completion in the early part of May.

This project is the result of much effort on the part of the members of the House Committee, Mr. Aaron J. Simon, Chairman, Mr. Hyman I. Cohen and Mr. Alexander Gross. This committee engaged the services of a consultant and made a survey of the conditions in our building and prepared necessary plans and specifications which were submitted to contractors. After many meetings to insure the best of all plans, the committee made its recommendations to the Board and received the Board's approval.

To the members of our House Committee go our thanks and appreciation for their diligent efforts and for their continuing supervision. The new cooling system will fill a sorely-felt need in our Synagogue building and will help make it even more comfortable and beautiful than it already is.

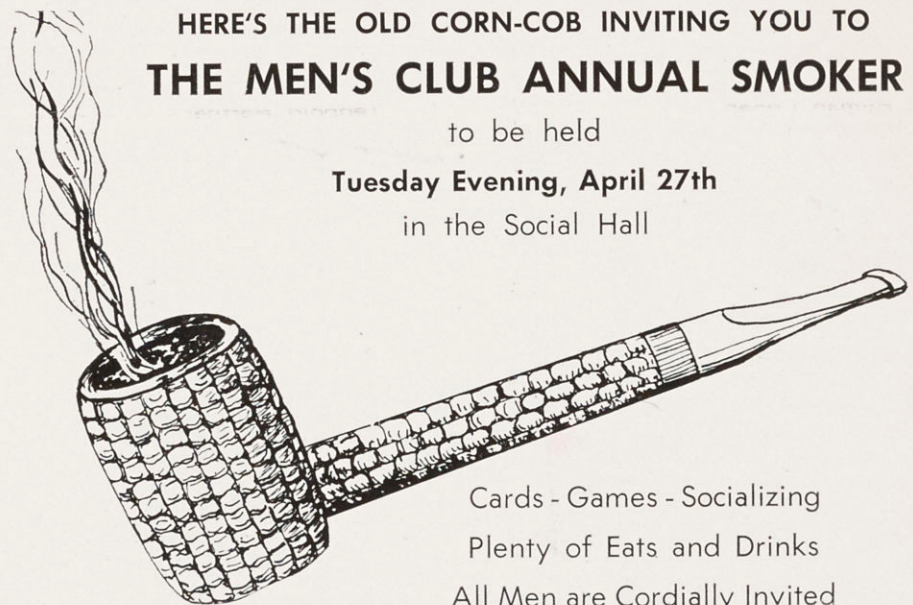
