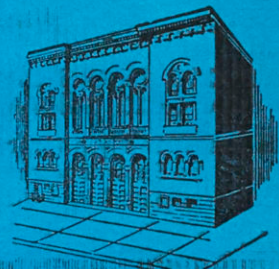

Max J. Etra, president of the congregation, announced the launching of our 1956 Year Book Campaign.

Over the years, our Year Book has set an example of what a congregational Year Book should be like. It has done this in two ways. The first by publishing a book of unusual beauty, which is not only a record of our Synagogue year, but also a source of important information and cultural inspiration.

In the second place, all the proceeds from the Year Book go exclusively to the Educational Scholarship Fund. Not one penny of the income derived goes to the Congregation itself. The Educational Scholarship Fund has been set up to provide educational scholarships for deserving children to those institutions and causes that are the sole beneficiary of this fund: Ramaz School, The Afternoon Religious School, Summer Camp Fund and the College Scholarship Fund.

The Year Book Campaign is, therefore, certainly a worthy one that merits the support of all. The children who are assisted by us come from all over metropolitan New York so the obligation is not strictly a local one. The Year Book campaign is one activity in which everyone can participate. It just means a little effort in soliciting ads.

In a short while you will be contacted for your assistance. We urge that you give it your attention promptly and wholeheartedly, for in this way you can insure the success of this year's campaign.

Again the Synagogue Office staff stands ready to lend every assistance to individual solicitors. Call upon them for any help you may need in obtaining ads. You will find that they can save you time and effort — and get the desired results with a minimum of work on your part.

"MENTAL HYGIENE FOR MODERN JEW" THEME OF DECEMBER 7th ADULT INSTITUTE LECTURE

The Adult Education Committee has announced that Dr. Morton A. Seidenfeld, Professor of Clinical Psychology of Yeshiva University, will give the second lecture in the K-J Adult Institute Lecture Series on Wednesday evening, December 7th. The topic under discussion that evening will be "Mental Hygiene for the Modern Jew."

This lecture is the second in the series on the theme "Modern Science and the Jewish Spirit". The series will open this coming Wednesday evening, November 30th with Dr. Bernard Heller, who will speak on "Psychoanalysis and Religion —Friends or Foes?"

Dr. Seidenfeld is a well known psychologist and educator. At present he is Director of the Division of Psychological Services and Public Education of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. In this position he inaugurated a research program on the psychological problems and needs of polio patients which lead to further development of their treatment. As director of Public Education for the Foundation Dr. Seidenfeld is in charge of the dissemination of information to the public.

During the war Dr. Seidenfeld was a Lt. Colonel in the United States Army serving as Chief Clinical Psychologist to the Division of Neuropsychology. He was instrumental in establishing clinical psychology as a medical service for Army personnel.

Prior to this Dr. Seidenfeld had been Director of Rehabilitation for the Tuberculosis Institute of Chicago and the Denver National Jewish Hospital. A

NOTES ON WEEKLY PORTION

Vayeze

Verses 12-16 of Chapter XXVIII describe Jacob's dream. Dr. Hertz writes, "We have here wonderful imagery which, in its own symbolism, speaks to each man according to his mental and spiritual outlook." What does this dream mean to you?

What do you think of the magnificent display of Jacob's strength described in Chapter XXIX. It seems that Jacob was concerned with the development of his body as well as his mind.

Laban, Jacob's uncle, welcomed his nephew warmly. In the light of what follows in the rest of the portion, do you think that welcome was sincere? See Dr. Hertz on verse 13 Chapter XXIX.

What was the position of the woman in the family in ancient times? In Chapter XXXI, Jacob consults with his wives and gets their approval before he makes a decision that will affect his family. See verses 4-16 and Dr. Hertz on verse 4.

Note that Jacob had several wives and that he was married to two sisters. Marriage to sisters was subsequently forbidden by the Torah, but polygamy is still practiced among oriental Jews.

During one talk he presented the important resolution to unify the Mizrahi and the Hapoel Mizrahi into one Religious Zionist Organization. His second address was in the form of an appeal for Bar Ilan University. The effect of his talk can be gauged by the results it brought — over \$400,000. was raised.
