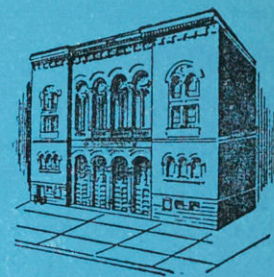

NOTES ON THE PURIM SERVICE

1. Regular Purim Services will be held Saturday evening in the Synagogue. Mincha will begin at 4:50 and will be followed by the Seudah Seminar. Ma'ariv will be held at 6:10 and will be followed by the reading of the Megillah. Our Cantor will officiate at Ma'ariv services and the Megillah will be read by our Ritual Director.

2. The Sunday service will start promptly at 9:30 A.M. The reading of the Megillah will take place at about 10:15.

3. Uniform prayer books, Taleisim and Megilloth will be made available to our worshippers. May we remind our menfolk, however, to bring their tephilin with them.

4. Religious School children will meet in their classes at the usual hour of 9:30. At 10 o'clock they will proceed to the Synagogue for the conclusion of the service and the reading of the Megillah. Ramaz children will join the service from the beginning. We invite all worshippers to bring their children to the service where they will receive noise makers and be escorted to a special section reserved for them.

Youngsters below the age of five, however, are not to be brought to Synagogue since they are too young to be able to participate properly in the service.

5. All worshippers are invited to be the guests of the Men's Club and Sisterhood at a Brunch which will be served them in the Auditorium. A special brunch for children will be served

TAMAR SHOHAM TO SPEAK ON "ISRAEL AND THE UNITED NATIONS" AT MARCH 5th SISTERHOOD OPEN LUNCHEON MEETING

Mrs. Hyman Abrams, president, announced an unusual program for the next Sisterhood Luncheon Meeting which will take place on Monday afternoon, March 5th, at 12:30 P.M. in the Social Hall. At that time we will be honored to have as our special guest Mrs. Tamar Shoham-Sharon, a member of the Israel Delegation to the United Nations. Mrs. Shoham will speak to us on the topic "Israel and the United Nations."

A second generation Sabra (a native of Israel) Mrs. Shoham was educated at London University where she specialized in Middle Eastern Affairs and Arabic Studies. During World War II she served in the British Army where, with the rank of sergeant, she was in charge of Libraries of the Western Desert.

At the end of the war Mrs. Shoham was sent to Europe where she took an active part in the rescue of displaced persons and in organizing their migration to Palestine. Later on she was sent to investigate conditions in North Africa.

In 1950 Mrs. Shoham joined the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and two years later was appointed head of the Office of the Director General. Since last August she has been a member of the Israel Delegation of the United Nations with her special field of activity being Economic and Social Council Affairs.

Behind the Scenes —

Mrs. Shoham is going to handle her subject matter in two ways. First, she is going to discuss with us Israel's relationship to the United Nations, a most timely subject. Secondly, she is, as a woman, going to tell of the personal experiences she has had as a delegate to that organization.

We have heard Mrs. Shoham speak before, and we can assure our members and friends of a most stimulating and enjoyable afternoon.

NOTES ON THE WEEKLY PORTION Tezaveh

The beginning of this week's portion describes the ritual of the eternal light. The perpetual lamp (Ner Tamid) located in front of the ark in the Synagogue of today is the modern counterpart of this ancient symbol. For its meaning see Dr. Hertz on verse 20 of chapter XXVII.

Chapter XXVIII describes in detail the vestments that priests were to wear during the performance of their sacred duties. It suggests the importance of appropriate dress in religious life. See Dr. Hertz' introduction to this chapter.

The Urim and the Thummim, an important part of the high priest's outfit, played a significant role in Jewish history. See Dr. Hertz on verse 30 of same chapter.

The meaning and value of prayer is suggested by the Hebrew translation of the word incense. See Dr. Hertz on verse 7 of chapter XXX.

ANNUAL APPEAL FOR PASSOVER RELIEF LAUNCHED

Every year at this time, the Congregation announces the launching of the Passover Relief Appeal, continuing a tradition of long standing in Jewish life — that of providing for those in need at Passover time. The Talmud speaks of this tradition, and Jewish communities the world over practice the custom by making available a fund from which Matzoth and other Passover necessities are purchased for distribution among the poor.

In our Congregation, this time honored institution of Mo'os Chitim has always elicited a warm and generous response. Our congregational family has, in recent years, been called upon to raise large sums of money at Passover time, and it has always met the challenge. This year, a minimum of \$5,000 will be required to take care of those causes and individuals who turn to us for assistance. How, and to whom, is this sum allocated?

To begin with, a large part of it will go to the Yorkville Passover Relief Fund, which takes care of the needy in our own immediate neighborhood. A major concern of ours will also be to provide as much assistance as possible to Israel, where our attention will be focused on the thousands of students and rabbis in Israel Yeshivoh who subsist on the barest necessities, hungry more often than not. Out of this fund, too, will we be able to take care of respectable and deserving families about whose need we know and who would normally not come to the attention of public charity.

We repeat the appeal contained in the letter you received this week. It is an appeal to our entire Kehilath Jeshurun family — members, seatholders and friends alike — to respond generously to our campaign this year. Above all, please do not delay. Send in your contribution at once if you want it to accomplish the most good. Please make your checks payable to the Kehilath Jeshurun Benevolent Fund.

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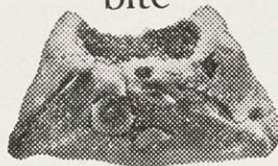

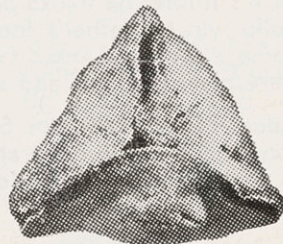
