

SIMCHAT TORAH IN THE SYNAGOGUE

FATHER AND SON MINYAN RESUMES SESSIONS

With a large, enthusiastic group participating, the Father and Son Minyan inaugurated its tenth season of activity last Sunday morning. Leading the service were the following cantors: Jerry Bruss, Albert Kleinhaus, Simcha Reguer and Ian Schor.

Johnny Mills and Jerry Pollack were honored for their outstanding participation in the minyan last year. Each was presented with a Hertz Prayer Book by Mr. William Lebowitz, the chairman of the Minyan Committee for the Men's Club, which sponsors this activity.

For the first time in our history there was a large representation of young ladies and an invitation is therefore extended to all of the "daughters" of the congregation to join the "fathers" and "sons" in prayer and at the delicious breakfast which is served following the service.

Led by Mr. Haskel Lookstein, a senior rabbinic student at Yeshiva University, and himself a Minyan participant for many years, this group affords an opportunity for the young people of the congregation to join with their fathers in an unhurried religious service enhanced by thought-provoking interpretations of the prayers.

Simchat Torah, always a gay festival at Kehilath Jeshurun, was outstandingly so this year.

As in the past, the celebration began on Shemini Atzereth. The Grooms of the Law were ceremoniously escorted to their places of honor on the front platform, near the Holy Ark. After some brief words of praise by the Rabbi, the President and Vice-president then escorted Mr. Isadore Schlang, Chasan Torah; Mr. Joseph Gershman, Chasan Bereshith; and Mr. Arthur Rosen, Chasan Maftir, to their places of honor.

The Hakafoth Service on Thursday night excelled in every respect. The entire Main Synagogue was filled with men, women and children. The procession with the Torah Scrolls was conducted with dignified gaiety. There were the traditional songs and, of course, the spontaneous dances led by the young people of the congregation, and highlighted by the participation of the young children. These youngsters were indeed "the life of our religious party."

On the next day, as part of the regular service, the Grooms of the Law were called to the Torah. An appropriate citation was read for each one of them by the Rabbi, and then they made their way to their Torah honors.

The holiday reached its climax at the close of services in the auditorium of the Synagogue House, where an elaborate kiddush reception was held
