ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM ANNOUNCED

TED COMET LEAVING SYNAGOGUE POST

Mr. Theodore Comet, who for more than four years was Executive Director of the Congregation and Principal of the Religious School, will be leaving these positions beginning with November 1st.

Mr. Comet asked to be relieved of his duties early in September. He did not want to make his severance public until after the entire High Holy Day season was over. He has been appointed Director of the Youth Department of the American Zionist Council. In his new post Mr. Comet will be in charge of the elaborate program of youth activities sponsored by the American Zionist Council, which is the overall organization comprising all of the different Zionist Parties in the United States. The post to which he has been called is one of the top posts of its kind, and the opportunities that he will have to utilize his talents and abilities are great indeed.

Mr. Comet, who is a graduate of Yeshiva College, and holds a Masters Degree from its Graduate School, received his basic training in youth activities, which has been his special interest throughout his professional career.

In our Congregation he performed ably as Executive Director, and distinguished himself especially in the field of choice, which is the guidance and direction of the Afternoon Religious School of the Congregation.

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Mr. Martin Markson, chairman of the Adult Education Committee, announced the schedule of courses for the forthcoming season. A varied program of courses has been prepared to provide for the interests of every member of the congregational family.

Highlighting the courses will be a series of lectures by Dr. Norman Frimer, Metropolitan Regional Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations. Dr. Frimer has lectured at Kehilath Jeshurun before and has unfailingly impressed his classes with his scholarship and skill as a stimulating teacher. The general subject of the Lecture Series is "What Jews Believe — Our Classical Heritage."

The Seudah — Seminar, which had been a great favorite in past years will be re-instituted. The first seminar will take place after the Mincha Service on Saturday November 16th. It will continue to meet thereafter on every Saturday until March 22nd.

The Talmud class will meet as in the past on Wednesday evenings. This class is instructed by Rabbi Hollander and will study the Tractate Makkoth.

Also meeting on Wednesday evening is a class in Basic Hebrew led by Mrs. Alice Rothkowitz, who is an instructor in our Religious School and has taught this class in past years. The content of the course will depend upon the needs of the registrants.

Our daily Mishna class will continue to meet for 15 minutes after the weekday morning service. The instructors
