1957 YEARBOOK HIGHLY PRAISED

The seventeenth Year Book published by Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun is by this time in the hands of most of the membership. This issue continues the tradition set by previous Year Books which have set the standard for volumes of this type.

The Year Book has a three-fold purpose. The first purpose is the presentation of a record of all that transpired in the congregation during 1956-57. The second is to present pictorial treatment of some topic of Jewish interest. The final purpose is the raising of funds through the publication of ads for our Educational Scholarship Fund.

A feature of the Year Book is the inclusion of the sermon "The Art of Memory" which Rabbi Lookstein preached on the first day of Rosh Hashanah, 1956. The Year Book will be consulted to study the sermon's timeless message for years after the reports of the activities will be of interest only as a historical record.

Pictorial Album —

As in the past, the Year Book is enhanced by a Pictorial Album. This Year's Album has as its theme the subject "Highlights of Jewish History on Israeli Stamps." The stamps of Israel, which have been awarded several prizes for their beauty in international competitions, and are often designed to illustrate noteworthy events in Jewish history. Designed by Marc K. Heine, the Pictorial Album includes events

from the major periods of Jewish history from the times of Moses to the War of Liberation of our own period.

Art Work is not limited to the Pictorial Album. A calendar for the Jewish Year 5718 is lavishly illustrated with illustrations of the zodiac mosaic of the ancient Beth Alpha Synagogue in Israel. The calendar includes a list of all Yahrzeits observed by members of the congregation as well as those whose names are memorialized on tablets in the synagogue.

Year In Review —

Of special interest is the section, "Synagogue Year in Review," which together with the committee reports comprise a complete record of every activity sponsored by the synagogue which took place during the past year.

All the proceeds of the advertising in the Year Book accrue to our Educational Scholarship Fund. Over \$18,000 were realized. These proceeds are allocated to the Ramaz School and to the Afternoon Religious School to enable promising students to obtain an education in these institutions. A portion of the fund is reserved for college and professional school scholarships for deserving graduates of the Ramaz School, and for summer camp scholarships.

The Year Book is dedicated to Mr. Jules Podell, whose devotion and effort made the volume possible. The generosity of Mr. Podell has enriched
