RABBI HOLLANDER TO SPEAK AT FIRST SEUDAH SEMINAR

The first Seudah-Seminar of this year will be held this Saturday afternoon. Following the Mincha Service at 4:00 o'clock, the Seminar group will meet in the Social Hall where light refreshments will be served. Cantor Plitnick will lead the group in singing the traditional Sabbath Z'miroth. Rabbi Hollander will then present an analysis of this week's Torah portion. A discussion will follow. A special invitation is extended to the ladies of the congregation to participate in the Seminar.

DR. FRIMER TO DELIVER SECOND LECTURE

The second in the Lecture Series — "What Jews Believe—Our Classical Heritage" will be presented this Wednesday night at 9:00 in the Social Hall. Dr. Norman Frimer, Metropolitan Regional Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations will speak on the subject "Judaism and the Concept of Israel—Are Jews a Chosen People?"

Talmud Class—The Talmud Class will meet with Rabbi Hollander at 8 in the Library.

Mrs. Rothkowitz's Hebrew Class will also meet at 8:00 on the fourth floor of the Synagogue House Building.

The Annual Thanksgiving Service of the congregation will be held this year on Thursday, November 28th, at 11 o'clock. This year, our guest speaker will be the Hon. Hubert T. Delany, former Justice of the Domestic Relations Court, who will speak on the subject "Integration — North and South." Rabbi Lookstein will again conduct the services.

These services have developed into a fine tradition by which a national holiday is invested with the appropriate religious tone. They have enjoyed a wide and enviable reputation for their beauty and for the high caliber of the guest speakers who have addressed them.

Judge Delany is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Colored People, the YMCA of New York and of many social welfare agencies in the city. He has been leader in organizations promoting better group relations in the United States and has first hand knowledge of the efforts being made in the courts to accelerate the progress of integration in the public schools. His ability as a dynamic speaker has gained him an enviable reputation.

Cantor Plitnick will officiate at the service, assisted by a choir under the direction of Oscar Julius. We extend a cordial invitation to all our readers and their families to attend this Thanksgiving Service at our synagogue.

Juvenile Delinquency Symposium At November 18 Sisterhood Meeting

Mrs. Oscar Perlberger, president, has announced that the next meeting of the Sisterhood will take place on Monday afternoon, November 18th, at 12:30 in the Social Hall.

A symposium will be presented on the subject "Juvenile Delinquency in Our Neighborhood." Participating in the panel are two men who are actively involved in programs to control the spread of juvenile delinquency in this area of the city: Patrolman Naeder and Bernard Clyne. Patrolman Naeder is Director of Youth Activities of the 19th Precinct which covers the area from 65th Street to 86th Street and from Fifth Avenue to the East River. He administers the Police Athletic League program and is responsible for establishing relationships with known and potential juvenile gangs and delinquents. As part of his duties, he maintains contact with the youth serving agencies in the area.

Bernard Clyne is a project worker for Interfaith Neighbors. He works with delinquents and potential delinquent gangs in our neighborhood.

In addition, a fascinating film on the case history of a delinquent called "Boy with a Knife" will be shown. The moderator will be Theodore Comet, Director of the Youth Department of American Zionist Council.

As you can see, the program will be a full and stimulating one, and we look forward to your joining us on November 18th. Luncheon will be served at 12:30 o'clock.
