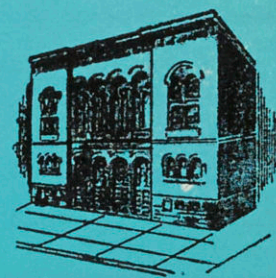

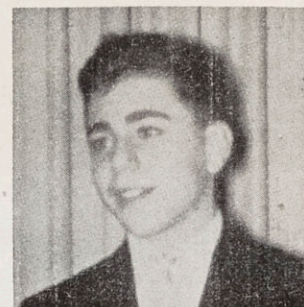

NOTES ON PURIM

For our Purim Service, we especially ask you to bring your children. Special arrangements have been made for them. We ask that you follow these instructions carefully.

Students of the Ramaz School will meet in the Auditorium at 5:30. Students in the Afternoon Religious School will meet in their classrooms at that time. Children attending neither of these schools should meet with children of their age group in the classrooms on the fourth floor.

We know that many parents would like to have their children sit next to them in the Synagogue. However, we ask that you cooperate with us by having all children sit in their special section.

Youngsters below the age of 5 should not be brought to the Synagogue. They are much too young to be expected to participate properly in the service. In order to avoid any embarrassment, we ask that you keep the very young tots at home.
