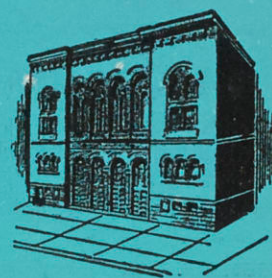

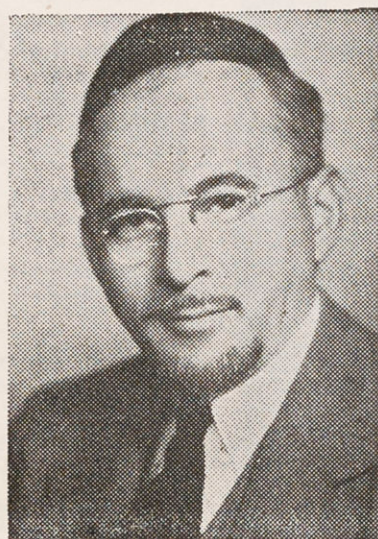

ANNUAL APPEAL FOR PASSOVER RELIEF LAUNCHED

Every year at this time, the Congregation announces the launching of the Passover Relief Appeal, continuing a tradition of long standing in Jewish life—that of providing for those in need at Passover time.

In our Congregation, this time honored institution of Ma'os Chitim has always elicited a warm and generous response. Our congregational family has in recent years been called upon to raise large sums of money at Passover time, and they have always met the challenge. This year a minimum of \$5,000 will be required to take care of those causes and individuals who turn to us for assistance. How, and to whom, is the sum allocated?

To begin with, a large part of it will go to the Yorkville Passover Relief Fund which takes care of the needy in our own immediate neighborhood. A major concern of ours will also be to provide as much assistance as possible to Israel, where our attention will be focused on the thousands of students and rabbis in Israeli Yeshivah who subsist on the barest necessities, hungry more often than not. Out of this fund, too, will we be able to take care of respectable and deserving families whose need we know and who would not normally come to the attention of public charity.

A special letter about this appeal was sent you this week. It is an appeal to our entire Kehilath Jeshurun family—members, seatholders and friends alike—to respond generously to our campaign this year. Above all, please do not delay. Send in your contribution at once if you want to accomplish the most good. Please make your checks payable to the Kehilath Jeshurun Benevolent Fund.

When you sit down at the Seder table you will have the satisfaction of knowing that your contribution helped others, who might not ordinarily come to your attention, celebrate Passover in a manner which would otherwise be impossible for them.

PASSOVER SEDER RESERVATIONS

As announced in last week's issue of the Bulletin a congregational seder will be held on the first two nights of Passover, Friday and Saturday, April 4th and 5th.

Plans are under way to make our Sedorim both beautiful and intimate. We shall again try to retain the family character of the occasion so that the true spirit of the Seder may not be lost. In order to achieve this we are limiting reservations to members of the congregation who may bring as their guests only the immediate members of their family. In addition, reservations will be accepted **only for both Seder nights.**

The sedorim involve unusual preparations. So that we may make arrangements well in advance, we ask that reservations be made without delay.

STANDARD AND POOR'S VICE-PRESIDENT TO ANALYZE BUSINESS OUTLOOK FOR MEN'S CLUB

In keeping with its policy of presenting speakers on problems of current concern, the Men's Club will hear Mr. Lewis Schellbach, Vice-President of Standard and Poor's Corporation, a leading economic research and analytic firm, discuss the outlook of the country's economy at its next meeting this Monday evening, March 17th, at 8:30 P.M. in the Social Hall. Please note the change in meeting night from Tuesday to Monday for this meeting.

Lewis Schellbach is graduate of Columbia University. Now in his thirtieth year with Standard & Poor's Corporation, he has worked his way through most departments in that corporation, from inquiry correspondent to editor of its most important service.

He is Vice-President in charge of all printed advisory services and director of economic research. In the latter post, he was one of the few economists who during the war foretold the postwar boom. His study entitled "Victory is Bullish," was in direct conflict with the commonly held view that the war would be followed by a severe depression.
