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DR. LEO ROSTEN, EDITOR OF LOOK MAGAZINE, TO BE THANKSGIVING SPEAKER

Once again, our Annual Thanksgiving Service, which this year will be held on Thursday, November 27th, will be graced by an outstanding personality. Dr. Leo Rosten, renowned political scientist and Advisory Editor to LOOK Magazine, will occupy our pulpit and will address our Thanksgiving congregation.

Our Thanksgiving Service is designed for the entire family. Parents and their children, young and old, have been coming from year to year in increasing numbers to participate in a Service that is of matchless beauty and inspiration.

Cantor Plitnick will officiate, assisted by the Oscar Julius Choir. Rabbi Lookstein will of course direct the entire Service.

Our guest speaker is a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Chicago. He is the author of six volumes that have won wide acceptance. He was a Fellow of the Carnegie Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation and the Social Sciences Research Council. He has written twelve movies and has contributed to the leading popular and scientific journals of the country.

Dr. Rosten has lectured at Stanford University and at Williams and Swarthmore Colleges, and has just been appointed Visiting Professor at the University of California.

RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN OPENS INSTITUTE LECTURE SERIES

Fifteen hundred years of Jewish history from the birth of Abraham to the destruction of the First Temple were covered by Rabbi Haskell Lookstein at the first lecture of the Adult Institute. In an eloquent address, the sixty persons in attendance were treated to a combination of an understanding of the philosophy of Jewish history and an account of the highlights and personalities who made history during the period covered.

Several thoughtful questions were asked of the speaker, following which the listeners retired to partake of light refreshment. If by chance, you were not able to be present at this session, the second lecture in the series will be held on Wednesday evening, December 3rd.

The subject of Dr. Rosten's address will be "Confessions of an Intellectual". We may expect a thrilling lecture from a gifted speaker and a brilliant mind. All are welcome to the Thanksgiving Service. Arrange to be with us, and by all means, invite your friends and they will thank you for it.
