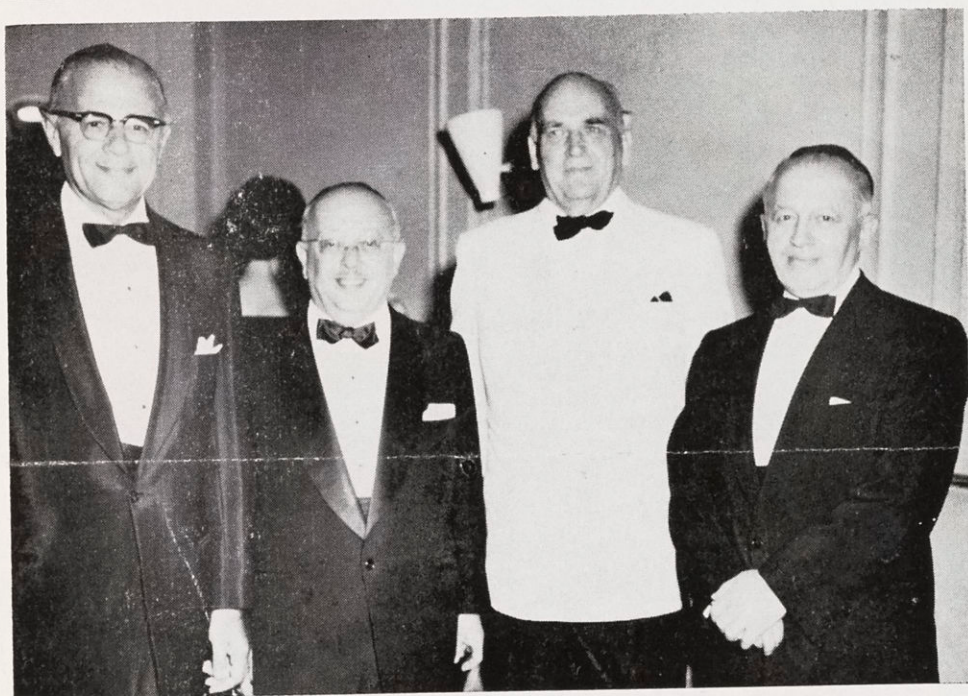

TORAH LEADERSHIP SEMINAR FOR TEEN-AGERS

The Torah-Leadership Seminar, sponsored by Yeshiva University, is being held this year from August 26th through September 7th at Camp Monroe, Monroe, N. Y.

University faculty members and guest lecturers will serve as instructors.
