Conclusion of Fast 8:15

Tisha B'Av commemorates the destruction of the first and second Temples of Jerusalem, and the first and second Jewish Commonwealths in the Holy Land. The ninth day of Av is the date of the collapse of the revolt of Bar Kochba and the fall of Betar. In the year 1492 on Tisha B'Av, began the expulsion of the Jews of Spain. In all centuries this day has been a day of sorrow and mourning.

The Book of Lamentations is read on Tisha B'Av and it expresses in elegiac poetry the immeasurable grief of Israel over the loss of the Temple.

The Kinoh which are read, bewail the tragedies of the Jewish People throughout the ages. They conclude with the fervent hope that a speedy redemption will come to Israel.
