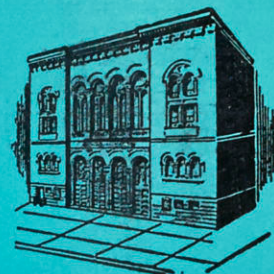

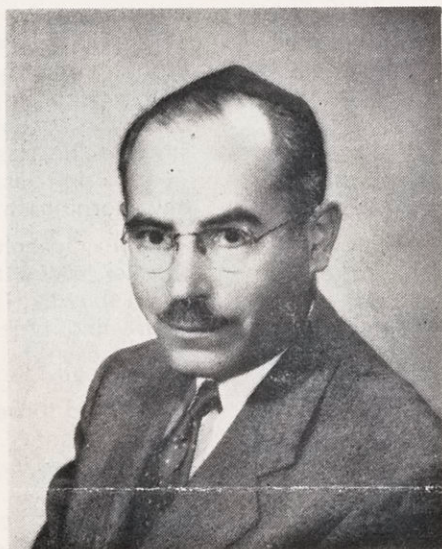

Traditional Judaism can be practiced to the fullest extent while living in a cosmopolitan city.

The meeting was a wonderful beginning of what promises to be a most successful Sisterhood season.
