OVER FIFTY AT FATHER AND SON SERVICE

SENATOR JACOB K. JAVITS ADDRESSES MEN'S CLUB AUDIENCE

Almost two hundred listeners heard Senator Jacob K. Javits address the opening Men's Club Forum Meeting of the season on Monday evening November 2nd.

Speaking on the subject "Foreign Policy and U. S. Jewry" the Senior Senator from New York State, known far and wide as a great spokesman for liberalism, impressed the audience with his penetrating grasp of the issues of world politics as they affect U. S. Jewry.

His comments ranged from an analysis of Egypt's stand on free passage in the Suez Canal for all nations, to a discussion of the civil rights issue in South Africa.

He called upon Jews in the United States to take an interest in the following crucial areas of our foreign policy: the exchange of students with other nations, individual civil rights all over the world, the program for "trade and aid", and the strengthening of the United Nations.

Underlying the Senator's approach to his entire subject was the following idea as expressed by him: "Jewry is not a narrow concept. It is tied up with every aspect of our lives, particularly with peace and security — the goals of United States foreign policy".

We waited a long time for the privilege of hearing from Senator Javits.

By actual count, fifty three boys, men, girls, and women were in attendance in the synagogue chapel as the Father and Son Minyan began its eleventh consecutive season of regular Sunday morning services.

From the opening recitation in unison of the blessings over the Torah at 9:30, until the last shot at the basket around 1:00 P. M., the participants engaged in a wonderful and spirited period of religious, nutritious, and invigorating activity.

Four young cantors led the service beautifully. They are : Larry Rabinowitz, Stuart Podell, Ian Schorr, and Jon Mills. For next week's slate, see the box elsewhere in this bulletin.

William Lebowitz, beginning his 6th year as chairman of this activity for the Men's Club, spoke briefly to the boys, and told them that this is the most important activity sponsored by the Club. One could hardly argue with him. The sight of over forty men and boys, in Talis and Tephillin, participating enthusiastically in a morning service, would be sufficient to convince the most obdurate skeptic.

If you have attended the Minyan regularly in the past, you need no invitation. If not, come down this Sunday at 9:30. You will see for yourself the immeasurable rewards to be gained from this activity.
