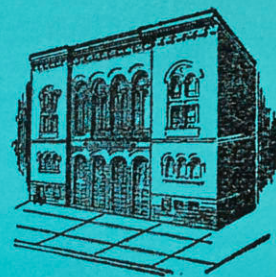

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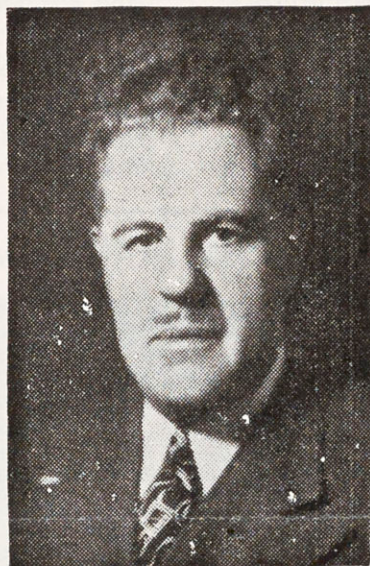

RAPID HEBREW COMPLETED Students Vote To Continue

An educational milestone in the life of our Adult Institute was reached last Wednesday evening December 2. On that date, fifteen members of the Rapid Hebrew Course for Beginners completed their program of study.

Having pursued the course avidly twice a week for a four week period, every student has successfully learned to read Hebrew,

The credit for the success of the class must be given to its teacher Mrs. Charles Cohen of Ramaz School. Mrs. Cohen skillfully instructed her disciples in the rudiments of reading and speaking, to bring them to the point of accurate reading of the prayer book.

In the final analysis, however, the praise and accolades ought properly to be directed to the students themselves, who worked diligently in class and at home to learn a new and difficult language. They proved conclusively that they are all still "young enough to learn."

The class decided to continue its studies with Mrs. Cohen on a once a week basis every Wednesday evening at 8:00, as a regular class in the Adult Institute.

YESHIVA UNIVERSITY NEWS

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF MEN'S CLUBS

One of the newest organizations sponsored by Yeshiva University is the National Association of Men's Clubs.

Organized but two short years ago, the Association, affiliated with Yeshiva University Synagogue Council, already boasts of sixty-four member clubs. Prospects are excellent for increasing the number to one hundred during the current year.

The National Association has held two conventions in its short history. The last one, held at the Pioneer Country Club during the past Decoration Day Weekend, was attended by more than three hundred delegates.

From East to West—

The Geographic distribution of the member clubs truly entitles the Association to the name "National". There are representative clubs from California (1), Connecticut (4), Illinois (2), Kentucky (1), Massachusetts 10, Ohio (1), New Jersey (5), New York (22), Pennsylvania (10), Virginia (2), and Canada (6).

The easternmost unit is the Men's Club of Beth Israel Synagogue, Halifax, Nova Scotia, while the western-

most affiliate is the Men's Club of Congregation Beth Jacob, Beverly Hills, California.

The consultant to the Association is Rabbi Bernard H. Walfish of the Community Service Division of Yeshiva University. The lay leadership of the organization shows the part played by our congregation in its founding.

Ira F. Weisman has served as National President since its inception. Abraham R. Kirshon is Second Vice President, Dr. Robert Wallach is a Delegate at Large, Dr. Jack Lieberman chaired a programming session at the last convention. Elgin Shulsky and Martin Markson are two of the four members on the editorial board of the Association's official organ—National Men's Club News.

Indicative of the K. J. Men's Club interest in the Association is an advertisement from our Club which appears in the Fall issue of the National Men's Club News.

We are proud of our part in helping to foster the activities of this fledgling but significant organization affiliated with Yeshiva University.

The urge to give gifts is even greater than usual this year because Chanukah coincides with the winter festival of other religions.

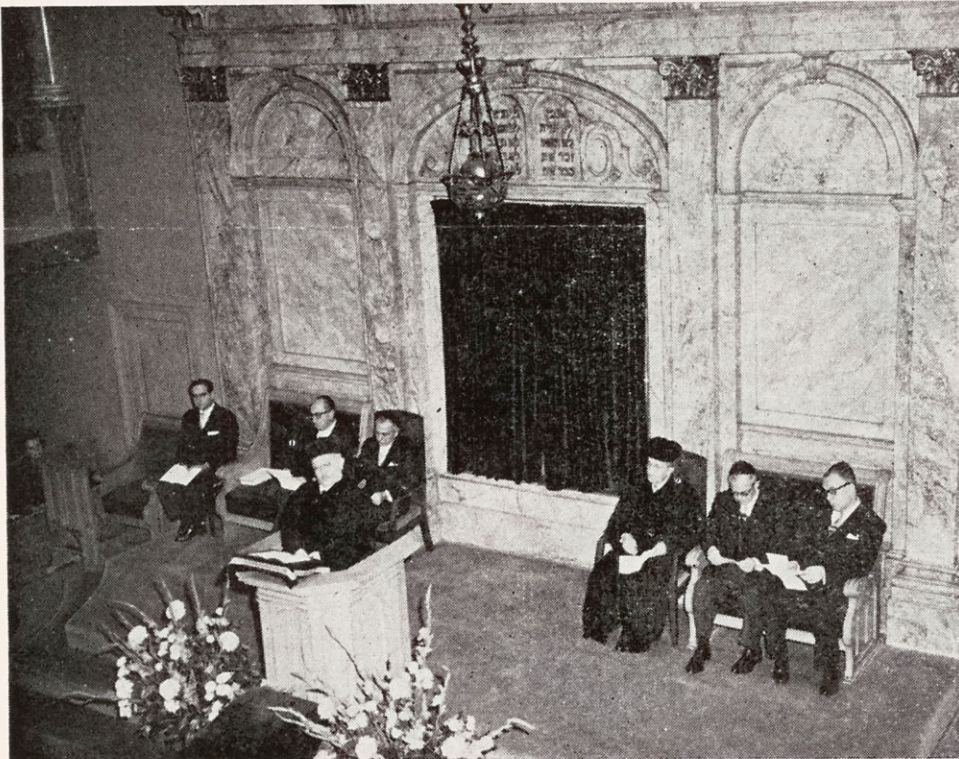

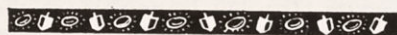

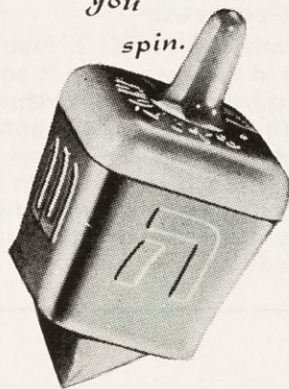
