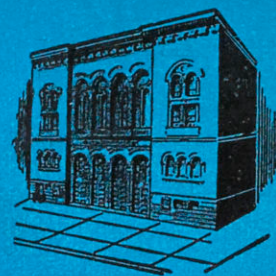

Young Adults Meet March 6th

The Young Adults League of the congregation will hold its first regular meeting on Sunday evening, March 6, at 7:30 in the synagogue social hall.

This new group in the synagogue, organized for young men and women from eighteen to twenty eight, was launched by a cocktail party recently which was attended by over one hundred young people. The March 6th meeting will be its first regular function.

A Personal Discussion

Besides the general social purposes which the group will serve, the organization will serve as a means to air problems that affect the Jew and Judaism in the modern world.

The topic for discussion at the coming meeting will be: "The Problem of Jewish Anti-Semitism." Much has been said about our relationship with non-Jews. Little or no consideration has been given to our relationship with ourselves.

This question is one which is fraught with hazards for us all. It will touch the inner feelings of everyone as he reacts to his fellow Jews in school, in business, and even on the street. The results should be most illuminating.

All young people interested in the Young Adults League are cordially invited to attend and participate in the meeting. The Young Adults will be happy to have you and we think you will be glad to be part of the group.

It seems like only yesterday that the Father and Son Minyan began its sessions for this season. Actually it was shortly after Sukkoth that the services began. Since that time fifteen sessions have been held on Sunday mornings.

The Minyan, which is in its eleventh year of consecutive activity, has opened its second decade in a very ambitious manner. There is no doubt that this season has so far surpassed all the previous ten in every respect. There are more worshippers than ever, more cantors than ever, and even better basketball players than ever.

Large Attendance are the Norm

Over one hundred boys have attended at least three or more of the fifteen services to date. The regularity of their attendance is attested to by the following figures. On two occasions the participants numbered over fifty five (not counting the more than one hundred worshippers at the special Men's Club service). Nine times the attendance has ranged from forty one to fifty. On only three occasions has the number dropped to the thirties.

Diverse Group of Cantors

This year we have tried to encourage as many different boys as possible to serve as cantors. The result has been that out of a possible sixty opportunities, thirty five boys have officiated. BENEVOLENT FUND CONTRIBUTES \$8,000 ANNUALLY

The Benevolent Fund is a name known well to all members of our congregational family. We all contribute regularly to its treasury. What is not known is the breadth and extent of the Fund's philanthropic activities. For the information of our readers, therefore, we submit the following report.

During the year 1959 the Benevolent Fund dispensed almost eight thousand dollars to needy individuals and deserving institutions. Who were some of the recipients?

Over two thousand dollars was sent to Israel for use by institutions and individuals there. These include Yeshivoth; scholarship projects, as, for example, the Talmudic Encyclopedia; welfare organizations which take care of medical and dental health for needy people; and special cases which do not benefit from organized charity in Israel.

One thousand dollars was donated to the Yorkville Joint Passover Relief Fund. A considerable sum was given to Yeshivoth in this country.

Personal Charity

In addition to organized charity the Fund is used for a more personal type of service. A father comes to our office with a statement announcing that his family will be dispossessed from its

apartment. The Fund is there to help. A child is in need of emergency surgery and the family cannot cover the expenses. The Fund renders assistance. Hard times come suddenly to a poor household; the Fund advances a loan. An immigrant rabbi needs help to publish an important work in Jewish Law. The Fund gives him a grant.

These are cases which cannot be helped by organized philanthropy. The Benevolent Fund serves each in a personal and dignified manner.

Sources of Revenue

The income to the Fund comes from a variety of sources. The collection basket passed around at every weekday service is a source of over two thousand dollars for the Fund treasury. The Passover Appeal brings in almost thirty seven hundred dollars. The Chanukah Candles result in another thousand, and sundry contributions account for the rest.

When, therefore, you have an opportunity to donate to the Fund, do not allow the opportunity to pass. You are making it possible for the congregation to take care of individuals and institutions that benefit greatly from our assistance. In all of this you have an important share because the Benevolent Fund directly reflects your generosity and your spirit of charity.

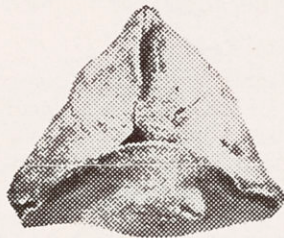
