NOTES ON PURIM SERVICES

1. Purim will be ushered in on Saturday evening in the synagogue. Mincha will begin at 5:50 P.M. It will be followed by a short talk by Rabbi Haskel Lookstein on the laws and significance of Purim.

2. Ma'ariv will begin at 6:45 in the main synagogue and will be followed by the reading of the Megillah.

3. The Sunday service will start promptly at 9:15 A.M. The reading of the Megillah will take place at 10:00 o'clock. Uniform prayerbooks and Taleisim will be provided for all. The men, however, are urged to bring their own Tephilin.

4. Students of the Park East Religious School will meet at 9:30 in the gymnasium from where they will be brought to the synagogue. Ramaz children and all other youngsters will assemble in the synagogue chapel at 8:45. They will be escorted to the synagogue from there.

5. All children will receive noise-makers at their places of assembly. please be sure, therefore, to bring your children to the proper place at the right time so that the necessary arrangements may be made for them.

6. Youngsters below the age of five, however, should not be brought to the synagogue, because they are too young to be able to participate in the service.

7. All worshippers are invited to be the guests of the Sisterhood and Men's Club at a light snack which will be served in the auditorium. The snack for the children will be served in the social hall.

Our two Am HaSefer groups held their second meetings during the past fortnight. Both meetings were extremely rewarding for the participants.

Group I discussed "Eva" by Meyer Levin at the home of Mr. and Mrs. William Lebowitz. The book, which presents a chronicle of a young girl who lived an incognito life during the war in Europe, provoked a very stimulating discussion on the subject of man's will to live and on man's inhumanity to man.

Group II discussed Isidore Epstein's "Faith of Judaism," a volume dealing with the fundamentals of the Jewish creed. The discussion followed the outlines of Epstein's book, touching on such subjects as the rationality of belief, the moral and personal need to believe, and the "personality" of God?

The value of this program does not lie primarily in the discussions themselves but rather in the reading carried on by the participants. The fact that thirty nine members of our congregational family will read four books of Jewish interest over the course of a six month period should be a source of gratification not only to the readers but to us all.

The next meetings are scheduled as follows: Group II will meet on Tuesday evening, March 29th to discuss Will Herberg's, "Protestant, Catholic, and Jew." Group I will meet on Monday evening, April 4th, to discuss, "The Scrolls from the Dead Sea" by Edmund Wilson. Both meetings will be held in the synagogue library.

YOUNG ADULTS HOLD FIRST REGULAR MEETING

The Young Adults Group of the congregation has blossomed into a regular congregational affiliate.

At its opening meeting, last Sunday evening in the social hall, the group showed that its start last month at a cocktail party was not a "one night's stand." At a meeting devoted to a serious discussion, a fine group of fifty young people attended and participated actively.

Under the leadership of Rabbi and Mrs. Haskel Lookstein the group discussed Jewish Anti-Semitism. The Rabbi brought to light a few startling examples of this social disease and the young people then analyzed the subject.

They discussed reactions to a demand for kosher facilities at certain colleges, attitudes toward the wearing of Jewish symbols as ornaments, and feelings about Jews who dress in a manner apart from other citizens.

The group finally came to an analysis of the attitudes displayed by Jews towards Harry Golden on the one hand and Herman Wouk on the other. Why is it that all Jews feel entirely comfortable with "Only in America" whereas many are disturbed by "Marjorie Morningstar" and "This is My God."

As you can imagine the discussion was a lively and provocative one and certainly stimulated a considerable degree of soul searching on the problem of the Jew's relationship towards himself. The meeting closed with refreshments and a social hour.

MEN'S CLUB TO HEAR DR. FATEMI ON RETURN FROM WORLD TOUR

Dr. Nasrollah Saifpour Fatemi, the former Iranian delegate to the United Nations, who will address the Men's Club meeting on Tuesday evening, March 22 will bring a world view to the Club's audience.

Dr. Fatemi has just returned from a study trip sponsored by Fairleigh Dickinson University which took him to Japan, Hongkong, Malaya, Indonesia, India, Pakistan, the Middle East and Western Europe.

Our lecturer, a graduate of Stuart Memorial College in Iran, received his M.A. and Ph.D degrees from Columbia University and the New School for Social Research respectively. He has published five books in Persian and is the author of two English volumes: Diplomatic History of Persia (1951) and Oil Diplomacy (1954).

A co-author of the Report on Palestinian Refugees, published by the Institute of Middle Eastern Affairs, Dr. Fatemi is currently engaged in two research projects: "The Economic Development of the Middle East" and "Nationalism in the Muslim World."

The Men's Club will thus be privileged to hear from an experienced diplomat, a world traveller, an erudite scholar in political science and economics, and an expert on Middle Eastern affairs.

His topic will be: "Behind the Scenes of the Tensions in the Middle East." Men and women, who are interested in this topic and who would like to hear from a fascinating personality, are cordially invited to attend.
