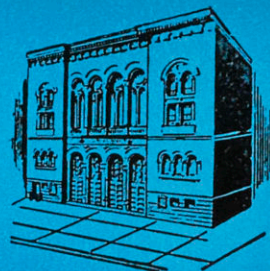

"FATHERS" TO OFFICIATE AT FINAL FATHER AND SON SERVICE ON SUNDAY

Concluding its most successful season in twelve years, the Father and Son Minyan will complete its schedule this Sunday morning at 9:30 with its twentieth service of the year.

The occasion will be marked by the appearance of the "Fathers" as cantors while the son (and daughters) will sit back in critical judgment. The men who will officiate are:

This service will bring to a close what certainly must be termed a fabulous year for the Minyan. Everything can only be described in superlatives as the boys, the girls, and the men, broke every previous record for attendance and participation.

During the nineteen services, the attendance, fell below forty only three times. On seven occasions, more than fifty-one worshippers participated. Over forty boys served as cantors at one time or another. Some five girls from the Park East Religious School were present at virtually every service. The men also turned out in numbers never before equaled.

Much credit must be given to William Lebowitz, the energetic chairman of this activity for the Men's Club. Besides lending personal support by attending regularly he also obtained sponsors for sixteen of the breakfasts.

Of course, the entire program continued under the active direction of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and his early rising assistant Gerald S. Kaufman.

This has been a wonderful season and the final service this Sunday at 9:30 should be something to remember. Come down and see for yourself.

TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY TEEN AGERS ATTEND CONCERT

Last Sunday afternoon, more than two hundred and fifty teen agers attended a Concert sponsored by the Youth Bureau of Yeshiva University. The concert was held in the auditorium of the synagogue house.

The Teen Age Group of our Congregation was host to this gathering which brought together young people from all over Metropolitan New York. Thirty one members of our own group were present.

The youngsters were treated to a thrilling program of amateur and professional talent. Singers and magicians, comedians and dancers provided enjoyable entertainment.

The highlight, of course, was Shlomo Carlebach. For well over an hour he had the teen agers singing and clapping to his classic rhythms. There were some who came to criticize, but all went away thoroughly impressed with an inspired and unusually talented artist whose main gift is a contagious sincerity of the spirit.

The K. J. Teen Agers now look ahead to their Theatre Party this Saturday night. They will meet at 7:15 in the synagogue house and proceed to the Bronx High School of Science.

Saturday April the 9th is Shabbat HaGadol — the Great Sabbath — in accordance with the Jewish calendar. In our synagogue this final sabbath before Passover will be "great" in another respect. On that day we will celebrate once again Yeshiva University Sabbath.

Kehilath Jeshurun has, over the years, been known as one of the closest congregations to Yeshiva University. Every facet of our organizational life is involved with this citadel of learning. Every area of Yeshiva's activity finds members of our congregation at work.

The president of Yeshiva University, Dr. Samuel Belkin, has been an esteemed trustee of our synagogue for many years. The chairman of Yeshiva's Board of Trustees is our own President, Max J. Etra. Both of our rabbis are graduates of its Theological Seminary. Many of our members are founders of its Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Still more are Ambassadors of the University, who contribute one thousand dollars or more every year to its maintenance.

Our Adult Institute obtains guest lecturers through Yeshiva. Our Men's Club is in the forefront of the National Association of Men's Club of Yeshiva. Our Teen Agers attend the conclaves and seminars run by the Youth Bureau of the University.

It is not surprising, therefore, in view of these close ties of our synagogue to Yeshiva, that our members should support the University with unusual generosity. Only last Sunday, at a special brunch, almost thirty thousand dollars was pledged by our members to support Yeshiva.

On Saturday, April 9th, we will dedicate our services to this first university under Jewish auspices in the United States. We urge all our members and friends to be present to honor the institution, its distinguished president, and its inspired ideals.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein will preach this Sabbath at 11:00 A.M.
